Elite madness

Hopefully by the time you are reading this, the two Vanarama National League South sides Hungerford Town (Lost 4-0 at Truro) and Slough Town (Won 1-0 at Dartford) have been able to kick-off their respective FA Cup Second Qualifying Round ties and Maidenhead United are beginning off their National League campaign at Sutton United.

It can't have been easy to prepare for these fixtures, at the time of writing there is still no confirmation that grants will be available to support clubs classed as 'elite' at steps 1 and 2 that cannot have fans in their grounds.

On Wednesday, Slough MP Tanmanjeet Singh Dhesi stood up in Parliament to highlight the plight of clubs with the Rebels in a unique position of sharing a ground with two clubs (Chalvey Sports and Langley) who can have supporters in attendance.

It's a bureaucratic reason that these clubs aren't allowed fans having pushed for the elite status to get the 2019/20 play-offs completed, that is now coming back to bite but the very worst scenario is that the National League doesn't start and is the only level of competition in the Pyramid that isn't playing the 2020/21 season. It seems ridiculous to be coming down to the wire, but we have to hope that something is in place to allow the competition to go ahead.

On a lighter note, I hope you'll join us on our live Hellenic League show, #EastMeetsWest which goes out on a Monday night (8pm) on our Facebook page.

Myself and Rob Davies are joined every week by Ryan Butler of Severn Sport as we discuss all things Hellenic League, from going through the results, picking up on the big stories and as we are at the moment, firing out a few predictions.

THE EMIRATES FA CUP

There will be no Emirates FA Cup debutants in the third round qualifying, with National League South side Braintree Town sneaking past Hashtag United on penalties after late drama at the Len Salmon Stadium.

With nothing to separate the sides for the majority of the 90 minutes, step-five Hashtag thought they had extended their maiden FA Cup adventure when Toby Aromolaran netted at the death to make it 1-0. But Braintree responded immediately through Olu Oluwatimilehin to force spot kicks, and Tom Anderson missed in sudden death to bring the Essex Senior Football League side's commendable run to an end.

The round's only other competition debutants, Newark, were also beaten by higher-league opposition, with Mickleover Sports prevailing 4-1 over their Midland Football League Premier opponents. Stuart Beavon put Sports in front in the 33rd minute, before the in-form Andrew Wright notched a second-half brace. Newark missed two penalties before Declan Bacon made it 4-0 late on, although the visitors did snatch a consolation through Elliot King. Two teams pulled off wins over sides three steps above them in the Nations League System. Christchurch reached the third round qualifying for the first time with a 6-5 shootout win over National League North Gloucester City, while strikes from Jahmal Howlett-Mundle and Danny Devine earned step-five Sheppey United a 2-0 victory over Welling United.

Another step five side, Chatham Town, pulled off a shock 3-0 win over fellow Kent outfit Folkestone Invicta, while Longridge Town and Skelmersdale United also beat teams from two divisions above them. A further nine sides were upset by teams from the league below them. Marske United and Cray Wanderers hit six goals apiece past Consett and Moneyfields respectively to progress in style, while Hartley Wintney, Cray Valley PM, Hayes & Yeading United, St Albans City and Taunton Town all scored five.

Among the 77 ties taking place on Saturday, former FA Cup semi-finalists York City narrowly saw off North West Counties League Premier side Warrington Rylands in front of the BBC cameras, with Sean Newton scoring the decisive goal. There were plenty of teams in need of penalties to progress, with Alvechurch, Barking, Brackley Town, Bracknell Town, Canvey Island, AFC Telford United, Chippenham Town, Dulwich Hamlet and Darlington all crawling into the round three draw. Eastbourne Borough, Ebbsfleet United, Larkhall Athletic, Halesowen Town, Bristol Manor Farm, Maldon & Tiptree, Tadcaster Albion, Royston Town, Weston-super-Mare, Wimborne Town, Marine, Stafford Rangers and Chester all kept their names in the hat after keeping their nerve from 12 yards, too. There were two more ties on Sunday, with Havant & Waterlooville and Concord Rangers also going into third round qualifying after wins over Horsham and Potters Bar Town respectively. The draw for the third round qualifying was held on Monday and ahead of the round's final tie – the postponed match between Whyteleafe and Burnham which ended with a 3-1 win for Whyteleafe.



Windsor FC • Club History



Summer 2011 and it's rather ironic that 100 years of senior football at Stag Meadow should be celebrated by the birth of a brand new club, Windsor FC, which came to be following the sad demise after 118 years of Windsor & Eton FC. During the final death throes of the previous club it became apparent, following several well attended supporters' meetings, that the will was there to continue to host a senior football club in Windsor for the community to embrace and, therefore, on February 4th 2011 WFC Football Community Development Ltd was registered with Companies House with the aim of achieving that objective. Founding Director Kevin Stott and a newly-appointed management committee then set about the long and sometimes arduous task of turning that dream into a reality.

Our founding season turned out to be a very exciting one, eventually finishing as runners-up to worthy Champions Guildford City in the league and we also made it to the semi-finals of the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy so it was close but no silverware to show for it, although that is not entirely true as Ryan O'Toole won the Golden Boot as top scorer in the Premier Division and Hayden Wheelers' efforts in editing our programme led to it being voted best programme in the Premier Division.

Several weeks into season 2012/2013 a major decision to operate without a budget was taken to free up funds for the regeneration plans at the ground and the management team and all but three of the playing squad left immediately. Mick Woodham was appointed as our new manager and had two days to get together a squad before our next league game. Despite some heavy defeats early in his tenure as he built a squad of local youngsters the club never lost faith and Mick eventually put together a squad that was to finish a very creditable 6th in the league as well as another appearance in the semi-finals of the county Senior Trophy competition whilst our Under 18's side made it all the way to the CCL's Grant McLellan Youth Cup Final eventually losing to a very strong Camberley Town side.

Recognition from the league away from football itself was achieved with a Groundsman of the Year award for the CCL and this was added to in August 2013 when our groundsman Lewis Clements won the FA Groundsman of the Year Award for the whole of Step 5 and 6 football nationally, something both he and the club are justifiably proud of whilst also giving some extra publicity to the CCL.

This building process continued in 2013/14, and it was in this season that Mick Woodham guided us to our first ever trophy. A resounding 3-0 victory over Reading Town in the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy Final. The success was repeated the following season when Woodham's young guns defeated a talented Flackwell Heath side 3-2 in the final at Burnham FC's Gore ground.

The football club experimented with a Senior Reserve side for one season before committing to a long-term link up with the Cox Green Academy and the re-focusing on an Under 18 team. The aim to offer a clear path to all youngsters to the Senior First team.

Over the past two seasons this approach has paid huge dividends. In 2017/18 Windsor FC made it through seven rounds of the FA Vase before losing to eventual runners-up Stockton Town in the Quarter Finals. In season 2018/19 another Vase run, which included an away victory at Chichester City saw Windsor reach the last 16.

In August 2019 long-serving Manager Mick Woodham left his position and Mark Cooper was appointed First Team Manager in September 2019.

PMW'S RAMBLINGS FOR BINFIELD FC - THE LONG WALK WITH TIMMY TABBY (3RD ISSUE)

This is one of my favourite shaggy dog stories, yet it's true. This is an account of Timmy Tabby's journey to watch Burnham Ramblers play at Watton United. 1992 is many many cat years ago.

Many years ago, in August 1992 to be precise, Timmy Tabby had a beginning to a season that he will never forget and he still lives to tell the tail. He earmarked his Saturday game at the unusual location of Watton, Norfolk. Watton United were playing Burnham Ramblers, he recalled, so there was an Essex connection and that part made some sense.

Timmy recalls a 1-0 score-line in favour of the home team, but what will go down in history is the route he took to get there. Out from London on the train, nothing wrong with that, even for our railway cat, then after changing trains at Ely, out of the caboose at Attleborough. What happened next was a 13 mile trudge to Watton United. No buses, no taxis, just four paws and his usual ruck sack.

Tabby says "I'm certain that I walked from Attleborough. I knew the location would prove difficult on public transport, but I mistimed the journey. I arrived at Attleborough at mid-day and had three hours to walk 13 miles. It was pushing it a bit. I arrived at 2.45 after a bit of jogging (remember I was a much younger scamp in those days) and have the programme and train tickets to prove it. A very, very long way. The walk was one hell of a pull on the dog's lead and that part makes no sense.



Timmy added "After the match, a reporter from the local newspaper took pity on me and drove me back to Thetford. I was on the train at 5.30 and back in London two hours later, absolutely exhausted.

He continued "I remember drinking two cans of coke to refresh the parts that usually have ale. Watton United's winner arrived five minutes from time, when all were contemplating a replay and an evening by the Crouch.

You also need to recall that this was the height of the Thatcher-Major period and any bus service, which did not make a profit was not likely to run. There were no buses to Watton from Thetford, though there was one from Norwich which arrived at 12.45, but alas no return journey.

HERE WE go again. This week, Boris Johnson urged people to go back to the cinemas following the sad decision of Cineworld to temporarily close its 127 theatres across the UK, affecting 45,000 jobs.

So, the question remains then Boris, if you are pleading with people to go back to watching films in the cinema - a small, enclosed arena with very little room for manoeuvre or ventilation - then why can't fans return to football in a much larger, outdoor, socially-distanced environment?

Last Saturday, 15 Vue Cinemas - Cineworld's main market rival - showed live Premier League matches, well attended by fans. How can you watch football in a cinema but not an open-air stadium? That's madness.

Quite frankly, I'm amazed - and mightily relieved - that more proud, well-established football clubs haven't fallen foul to these testing Covid times and credit for that lies with the people who work tirelessly - usually without financial reward - to keep our clubs alive.

But, with a second Coronavirus wave threatening to kick in and tougher restrictions gradually being put in place, there comes a point when something has to give, as Cineworld have shown.

Last week's £10m Government bailout to the National League at least papers over the cracks for a few months but, at the time of writing this, clubs are still waiting for news of their reimbursements almost a week on and with their season already underway.

Indeed, poor communication throughout has been a huge issue during this uncertain summer and that's something that needs to be addressed in any future Covid post mortem.

Personally, I'm still dismayed by a lack of assistance, and greed sometimes, of the mega-rich Premier League and its member clubs during this crisis.

No fewer than six players in Gareth Southgate's England squad for this week's friendly with Wales and Nations League games against Belgium and Denmark boast a Non-League background. Doesn't that show that football at this level is impacting higher up the Pyramid?

In the week when Macclesfield Town were wound up by the High Court for debts totalling £500,000, Chelsea were spending £22 million for a replacement goalkeeper.

A couple of weeks later, Arsenal then opted to severely damage their once proud community ties by dumping its much-loved mascot Gunnersaurus - for the sake of £120-a-week - before then spending £45 million on Thomas Partey.

Obviously, I'm not suggesting bailouts of those proportions but what a gesture it would be from the 20 Premier League clubs if they put aside, say, £1 million each, to strengthen their community ties when it is needed most and keep their local clubs alive?


Cineworld's demise is a worrying turn of events for the entertainment industry, of which sport plays a significant part.

Agreed, Boris, let us support our cinemas, theatres and music venues - socially distanced, of course - but how about including football stadiums in that too?


