BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947.

In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend – this season we will field 36 teams each week.

We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

THE BIG PREVIEW

BINFIELD VS WESTFIELD

The Moles have the opportunity to make it three wins on the bounce in the league as they host Westfield this evening - something that no one would've predicted a couple of weeks ago. But the visitors are in terrific form themselves, looking to make it seven wins on the bounce after a 5-4 victory at South Park last weekend.



Jacob Breckon scored a brace in midweek which has contributed to nine league goals in Westfield colours this season making him their top scorer in the league. Manolis Gogonas and Billy Nutbeam have been ever-present in the Westfield campaign this season - featuring in all 22 games and providing the solidity at the back. Westfield could move into the playoff positions this week if they take the three points tonight and Corinthian-Casuals defeat Raynes Park Vale.

A 94th minute winner by Ethan Lindo gave the Moles their first victory at home this season and it was the first time they have kept a clean sheet at the Iconic in all competitions. The recent signing of Killian Barrett has been a great edition for the Moles and his performance gained a lot of plaudits at the weekend especially against a strong Southall side.

Both teams are on scoring streaks with neither team drawing many so expect many goals tonight and hopefully a competitive game as well.

Head to Head:

Westfield have the edge of the head to head record between the two sides, winning three of their previous five meetings. Binfield's last victory came in October 2021 with Callum Bunting scoring twice and Sean Moore adding the others.

Earlier This Season:

The Moles' trip to Woking Park was a typical example of a game of two halves. Both teams converted penalties inside the first 20 minutes and the Moles pegged Westfield back again with Jimmy Bamgbose's first goal for the club. But the Moles struggled in the second half and clinical finishing from Westfield led to a heavy defeat.

Last Time at the Iconic:

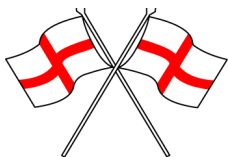
When Westfield visited the Iconic a year ago, but teams were struggling in form and it was reflected in the first 30 minutes. But Westfield took the lead against the run of play when Didi Ndombe broke through the Moles defence and slotted home. They doubled their lead just after half time when Ndombe intercepted a quick throw and was able to finish well over Harvey Rackley-Hayes.



This cued a 20-minute onslaught by Binfield who attempted to get back into the game. Firstly, Liam Gavin was unable to keep his header down from a Luke Brophy free kick. Then substitutes James Beauchamp and Taylor Morgan combined but the latter couldn't find the target when 1-on-1 with the keeper. A goal mouth scramble looked to give the Moles a lifeline but Kai Hobbs and Lewis Pegg's shots were both blocked. They eventually pulled a goal back through James Beauchamp but it is too little, too late as Westfield took home the points.

Late drama at the Iconic Stadium sees Binfield FC win at home for the first time this season. An injury time winner from Ethan Lindo was enough for the moles to collect all three Isthmian League points on Saturday afternoon. The visitors, Southall FC, who are high flying at the top of the Isthmian League, visited the iconic stadium having lost only one of their last nine games.

A tense match with very limited clear-cut chances was goal-less at the break but Binfield managed to secure the win late on as Ethan Lindo broke free on a counter attack in injury time.

The goal sparked jubilant scenes at the Iconic Stadium as the ball passed Southall stopper Michael Edegbe and into the back of the net for his second goal for the club.

Despite a late onslaught from the visitors, the Binfield defence were able to stay strong and keep a clean sheet in what is a huge win for the moles.

Next up is another home match on Tuesday night, as the moles face Westfield FC at the Iconic Stadium.

WHEN MOLEY MET ROSS SOUTHALL (H) EDITION



Moley : Ross, congratulations on your first home win as Binfield first team manager, sum up your feelings for me after that one.

Weatherstone : *"Yeah, it feels better than last week based on the events that happened after the game. It was nice to be able to celebrate the three points properly. It was great to get the chairman and everyone involved in the club in the dressing room after the game. The aim is to bring the club together, galvanise and celebrate the hard work that everyone is doing and it's really nice to see some smiles back on faces in and around the club."*

Moley : Two wins on the bounce, but it's not going to be job done until the final game of the season. Just talk us through the next few weeks and the rest of the season.

Weatherstone : *"Before I answer that, I would just like to say, Southall were outstanding today... There was moments and patches in that game where as I thought they they were excellent and demonstrate why they were second in the league. But to move on, the two wins that we've just had – I have to give full credit must go to players for listening. They've executed the game plans, we've been resilient in a defensive structure and then, we've had opportunities, we've been clinical. There's still a long, long way to go and as far as I'm concerned, the process has just started. I do want everyone to continue to BELIEVE. I want everyone to continue to support us because, as I think I've said a number of times, we're going to need everybody if we're going to replicate today's performance, and build a base for results in the coming weeks."*

Moley : You spoke there about the defensive resilience, just sum up how well they played today.

Weatherstone : *"I always talk about the whole team from a defensive structure and that starts from our frontline. They all have a duty to make sure defensively we set up correctly and I think obviously the forwards always get the success when they score goals. It's equally as important that the defenders and the goalkeeper get the reward when you keep a clean sheet. I think that's the fantastic and testament to the work that you know that they've put in today. You know, massive shout out to Reese (Jones-Junior) at right-back, Tutts (Charlie Tuttle) at left-back who is obviously come back to The Club and I thought Luke (Wayborn) and Jack (Matton) in the heart of the Defence."*

They were fantastic as a new partnership, and then on top of that Killian (Barret) as the goalkeeper made a massive save against Met Police in the last minute last week and as equally kept us in it today. The more that they can continue to stay grounded and continue to work on making sure that their performance is that level, it's going to give us as a football club every opportunity to to achieve what we all want."

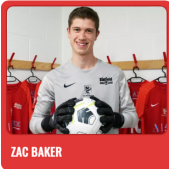

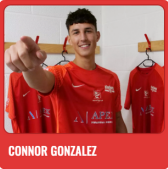

Chertsey are three points clear, Westfield win a nine goal thriller, Woods get three, Baggies beat Vale- again- and we've victory for Met, Tanners and Rovers

Leaders Chertsey Town were given a boost without even playing when closest rivals Southall lost in midweek, but the Curfews didn't really seem to need any help with their promotion push. Eighteen games unbeaten, and having won their previous four whilst scoring a rather incredible twenty two goals, the leaders welcomed Ashford Town, and went ahead just after the half hour mark, Conor Lee with the opening goal from the spot. A red card for the Tangerines just after the start of the second half made things more comfortable for the Curfews, Ahkeem Belford dismissed, and it got more comfortable still when Sam Omperon made it two. That comfort evaporated when the ten men hit back eight minutes from time, Jack Smith reducing the arrears, but the Curfews held on and opened up a three point lead at the top.

Marlow v Guernsey was postponed due to a fault on the Green Lions plane. Leatherhead, in fourth place and five points behind the leaders at kick off, were on the road to Thatcham Town. The Tanners had lost only one of their last nine matches, but were held at Hartley Wintney in midweek; whilst the Kingfishers had lost only two in ten but would have been disappointed by their defeat in Guernsey last weekend, particularly after they equalised with ten minutes to go. Leatherhead had won each of their South Central encounters against Town, including a five-nil win at the end of September, and went ahead in this one just before the break, Tyler Cox giving the a half time advantage. The Tanners made it two-nil with sixteen minutes left, Trevan Robinson with that one, and that was that- they climb to third.

Raynes Park Vale plucked victory from the jaws of defeat at Guernsey in midweek, and were on the road once more- only this time not quite so far, they journey ending at Badshot Lea. That victory ended a run of three defeats, but having opened up a four point gap between themselves and sixth place Hartley Wintney they wanted to at least maintain that advantage- but these weren't their favourite opponents. The Baggies defeated Vale four-one in South West London in September, and also defeated them twice in Combined Counties Premier South last season, and were ahead in this one after a quarter of an hour, Joshua Keeya scoring for the second time this week. The Baggies added a second goal with a quarter of an hour left, Nick Medcraft with that one, and the Baggies held on for three points- and probably wish they could play Vale every week! Badshot Lea are up to eighth.

THIS week, we had the pleasure of talking to Warrington Town goalkeeper Dan Atherton, who has discovered a rather handy penchant for scoring goals.

Golden boy Dan, the former New Saints and Hyde United stopper, netted the first goal of his career back in October to earn Mark Beesley's side a last-gasp 1-1 home draw with Farsley Celtic in National League North.

And he was at it again a fortnight ago, popping up to dramatically head home another last-minute leveller for the Wire in a 2-2 draw with Alfreton Town.

Somewhat humbly, Dan put his goalscoring prowess down to being in the right place at the right time, but whether you wear the number one jersey or 100, having that natural predatory instinct is an art in itself.

"I have no idea where it's come from, it's certainly not planned," Atherton told us. "I'm just glad to be able to contribute to the team. Even when I go up for a corner, I'm not really intending to score; I'm just looking to take a runner or two away and cause a bit of chaos. Fortunately, I've managed to get my head on a couple and they've gone in!"

A Liverpool trainee from the age of 11, Atherton learned his trade from the very top and put his ball skills down to working at the Melwood Training Ground with Pepijn Lijnders, the Reds' former Under 16 coach who is now Jurgen Klopp's first-team assistant.

There, he trained alongside Brazilian first choice keeper Allison, who famously scored a 95th-minute winner for Liverpool at West Bromwich Albion in May 2021 to earn Klopp's men a Champions League place.

Just having that extra strapping body in the box for a last-gasp corner or free-kick is enough to throw opposition defences, even more so these days with goalkeepers coached to be as comfortable with the ball at their feet than their outfield counterparts.

Who can remember enigmatic Paraguanayan José Luis Chilavert? He was a free-kick expert for club and country and scored 67 times during his career, including eight for Paraguay. He is also the only goalkeeper ever to score a hat-trick.













The record for most goals scored by goalkeeper is held by the Brazilian Rogério Ceni, with 129. He scored his 100th goal in a 3-0 win for São Paulo on in 2011.

Two goalkeeper records, however, have been set in English football. On November 2 2013, Stoke City goalkeeper Asmir Begović recorded the fastest goalkeeper goal in football history (13 seconds), while Newport County's Tom King scored from the longest distance – 96.01 metres, in a match against Cheltenham Town in January 2021.

So, the next time your team are a goal down and in need of a saviour, don't be surprised to see your big number one surging up the field to provide some divine intervention. Like Dan Atherton, he could be your unlikely hero.
