

# BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar.

We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the last two disruptive seasons, during the pandemic the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre. Our 1st season ever at Step 4, However the last season will of course be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2. In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, we finished 8th after a good start.

Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. Last season, we finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a reply by Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

# THE VIEW FROM THE DUGOUT

Good afternoon, today we host Badshot Lea FC and we wish everyone a warm (let's hope it warms up soon!) welcome to the Iconic Stadium. I'd like to wish their management team, the players, all the officials and fans a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home after the game.

Today we host Badshot Lea FC, who have a manager in Gav Smith, whom I respect a great deal, he coaches and plays the right way, which is something I admire about the way he sets up to win football matches. Badshot Lea FC, find themselves in the same position as my team this time last year, doing everything they can to win football matches to stay up! It feels like roles are reversed from when we had to play Badshot Lea FC at Slough Town FC last year needing nothing but a win to stay up! With this in mind, I know that today presents one of our hardest challenges and we've prepared the players for this.

Following my last notes against Hayes & Yeading FC, where we lost 1-0, we also played Sutton Common Rovers FC away where we won 3-1.

Hayes & Yeading FC at home was a very tough test against an experienced team that managed the game well. The frustrating part for me, was the goal they scored, as it came from a long throw where we got first contact and second contact but the ball fell kindly to them where they tapped home from inside the 6 yard box. On a more positive note, the way we asked questions in the second half and created moments to get a result was something the players could take into our next game. I never like losing but the players gave everything and that is exactly what the management team will continue to ask in every game.

Sutton Common Rovers FC away on a Friday night was always going to be our target game for the week. Traveling into London on a Friday night is never easy, so our first challenge was to get everyone to Carlshilton, which I am delighted to say that we did, at this point I knew the preparation was solid.

Based on the surface, I asked the players to play in a different way when we had the football, I am delighted to say the players listened and went out and executed 2 very good goals that we had planned before half time. The second half was a tight half, however, we did create 6 goal scoring opportunities but did not capitalise on the chances until we got a penalty late on to secure a well deserved win. It was great to see so many Moles travel to the game.

The result against Sutton Common Rovers FC was 3 points very much needed, in the challenge we face to finish as high as we possibly can and not get sucked into the relegation scrap. I feel we are definitely at least 9 points short of where we should be on the league table, based on games where we conceded late on in games or didn't convert chances to get points! I believe everyone at the club should feel positive with what the team have done so far this season, as in the majority of games we have competed, in a very tough league. With a Semi Final, a Quarter Final, 14 league games to go and lots of league points to compete for, please be rest assured, as we approach the final stretch, all of my management team and the players will be giving everything for the club.

Over the coming weeks, I am back in hospital, over the last month it has been great to see everyone and your kind words have been greatly appreciated, words I will take with me as I go into the next stage of my challenge, so thank you everyone. One of our biggest strengths as a collective is how we stick together as a club, so let's hold onto this value as we hit the final stretch, lets stick together & enjoy it.

I hope you all enjoy the game today and thank you for your continued support.

# INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

## BADSHOT LEA FC

Early history suggests that the village football club was formed in 1904, after a meeting at the local village hall. They initially played friendly matches before deciding that they affiliate to the Surrey County Football Association in 1907. They began life in the junior leagues before gradually progressing through the leagues. The most recent history shows the Lea playing in the Aldershot leagues and progressing through the various divisions, eventually obtaining promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League Western in 1978.

Progress through the three divisions saw the Lea eventually promoted to the Surrey Premier League in 1986. This was for one year only as we obtained the dubious distinction of being relegated with the highest points total ever achieved by a side being relegated.

Season 1988 saw us again in the Surrey Intermediate League Western. The ensuing years saw the difficulties that one experiences until season 2002/03 which saw eventual promotion to Senior Football via The Hellenic League. This was not without its problems as The FA at Soho Square tried to block the move. It was only the determination of the committee and the full backing of The Hellenic League that eventually saw us given the green light along with London APSA (Essex Senior League) and Sporting Bengal (Kent League). In our first season we took time to adjust to Senior Football eventually finishing 4th from bottom under the guidance of manager Maurice Gregory.

In 1997 the first Youth Team joined the Club, and this saw the beginning of the successful Youth and Colts section of the Club. We increased from one team to over 20 and were given extra facility to accommodate this success.

For season 2017/18 we started a groundshare arrangement at Camberley Town whilst our new ground was under construction. In October 2017, Michael Charles resigned, and we turned to ex-manager Mark Thomas who successfully led us to immediate promotion back to the Premier Division at the end of the 2017/18 season.

Sadly, Mark had to resign his duties and after an extensive search and interview process, we appointed the successful Keith Hills, from fellow Premier Division team Knaphill, to lead us back into the Premier Division for season 2018/19.

In December 2018 we appointed a management team of Gav Smith/Dave Ford as Joint Managers along with Paul Harkness as coach and Dan Bailey as assistant. They galvanised the squad and finished in an excellent 9th place.


In season 2021/22 we finished in the highest position of 5th in the Combined Counties Premier Division South and were the only team to win away to Jersey in the league and in the following season we gained promotion to Step 4 for the first time in our history having finished as one of the highest runners up nationally on PPG.

Currently under the management of Gavin Smith assisted by Dan Bailey and First Team coach Vic Ocansey, we are now members of the Isthmian League South Central League in our first season at Step 4 of the Non-League Pyramid.

## **Horndean burst the Ascot bubble with a four-three win, Tanners get five, Borough get four, Binfield three, whilst Westfield and Sparks are also victorious**

Onto Saturday, and leaders Farnham Town, who rather remarkably have played only one league match THIS YEAR, saw their match against Guernsey postponed. Second place Kingstonian's match at Badshot Lea departed the same way, as did the games at Hayes and Yeading and Raynes Park Vale, and third place Ascot United were the top ranked team to start.

The Yellars played host to Horndean. United had lost only one of their last ten- and won six of their previous seven- whilst the Deans seemed to have hauled themselves out of their slump and were three unbeaten, taking seven points from that run. Zak Willett put the visitors ahead in the first minute, although the goal was initially given to Rudi Blankson- and the shellshocked hosts found themselves two down just two minutes later, Willett with that one, too. On twenty five minutes Kickie Dzimba got a goal back for the hosts, and they were level ten minutes later, Anas Igozouln scoring from the spot. The Deans weren't downhearted, however, and Willett restored their lead on sixty seven minutes to claim the match ball, only for the hosts to level via an own goal three minutes later. Back up the other end and it was four-three Horndean, Jay Williams with that one, and this time the visitors held onto their lead.

Hartley Wintney were rather determined to hold onto fifth place- or perhaps climb to fourth- as they travelled to Imber Court to take on Met Police. The Row had only two defeats from ten and were looking for a third win in succession, and they took an early lead as Ellis Orsborn scored after twelve minutes. The boys in blue drew level eight minutes before half time, Laurence Ernest with the equaliser, and that turned out to be that- although we did have a red card in added time right at the end, Ayoub Enajar sent off for the hosts.

Moneyfields saw their eight match winning run come to an end at Uxbridge last weekend, and hoped to start another as they travelled to Westfield. The Woking side, who were seven points and four places behind their visitors at kick off, were three unbeaten and seemed to have found their feet after a recent slump, coming into this one after an impressive win at Leatherhead in midweek. They went ahead just before the half hour, Tom Dryer with the opener- although they could have been behind by then, keeper Lewis Gallivant saving a penalty. The Moneys levelled five minutes into the second half, an own goal giving them a helping hand, but Billy Nutbeam quickly restored the Westfield lead five minutes later- and this time they held onto it.

Hanworth Villa, four points away from the top five, headed to South Park Reigate. The Villains were three unbeaten, whilst the Sparks were nine without a win and had dropped into the bottom four accordingly- but the hosts had the brightest of starts, George Vincent putting them ahead in the first minute. The next eighty nine minutes and added time saw nobody else manage to do what Vincent had done after thirty nine seconds, and the Sparks held on for three valuable points which lifted them out of the bottom four.

Harrow Borough were offering free entry to anyone with an NHS pass for their match against Southall on Saturday, and midway through the first half perhaps someone was able to supply smelling salts to the visiting fans as they witnessed Brendan Matthew being sent off. This was the sides third meeting of the campaign, with Borough winning the first two- and they soon went ahead in this one, too, Kai Hamilton opening the scoring on twenty six minutes. The ten men soon hit back, however, Ryan Hope levelling from the spot two minutes before half time, but that was as good as it got for them, as the second half was one way traffic. Stephane Bombelenga made it two-one on sixty three minutes, Dennis Kelmendi added a third ten minutes later, and ten minutes from time Keegan Bloom added a fourth. Borough are ninth- four points away from the top five.

Leatherhead, in eleventh, travelled to take on Rayners Lane. The Tanners had slipped nine points away from the top five despite only losing two of their last ten, whilst Lane had won only two of ten, and were three places and five points behind their visitors. Lukas Franzen-Jones has been a big success since landing at Fetcham Grove, and it was his thirteenth Tanners goal which was unlucky for Lane on ten minutes, and the hosts luck didn't change as they had Mike Hill dismissed eight minutes later. The ten men were level in first half added time, Deshane Dalling on his debut, but six minutes into the second half the visitors were ahead once more, Anuar Ceesay the scorer. It was three-one seven minutes later, Rhys Murrell Williamson with that one, and on sixty five minutes Kane Fitzgerald added a fourth, only for Anthony Cook to pull a goal back two minutes from time. One minute later it was five-two, Ty Butler for Leatherhead, but still we weren't finished and Germaine Dua pulled in back to five-three. That, finally, was that, seven points between the Tanners and the top five, having done the double over the Lane and scored eleven goals in the process.

IN last Sunday's NLP, we spoke exclusively to National League CEO Mark Ives to look deeper into the national 3UP campaign, officially calling for a third promotion spot into the EFL. Backed by all 72 member clubs at Step 1 and 2 after years of planning, the proposal officially calls for a change in regulations from the current two-up system and has received widespread support from the Non-League game.

But, as we've also heard this week, the campaign has also come up against some fierce opposition and there is a lot of convincing left needed to be done if EFL clubs are to vote in favour of the proposal at the EFL's AGM this June..

Ives spoke passionately the logistics behind the campaign but also warned that unless the matter is addressed now, it risks being kicked down the road for more years to come.

"Why now is a really important question," he told The NLP. "Everybody is aware we've been having conversations privately with the EFL. They've been very constructive, very amiable conversations.

"Then we have the Independent Football Regulator coming in. Whilst there are debates ongoing at the minute between the parliamentary houses and, potentially, up to 400 suggested amendments to the Bill that are being discussed, what is sure is the regulator is coming into play.

"That brings in another dynamic from an EFL point of view because the EFL are saying while they're supportive in principle of this issue, they cannot take this forward until the other footballing matters are dealt with - the current discussions between the PL and the EFL over the wider distribution of monies. That's a matter for the PL and the EFL, that's not a matter for us.

"We do not see them as being interdependent to the issue of three-up. If you think about them not being able to deal with anything until the matter is resolved between the PL and the EFL, which would potentially mean the regulator, the backstop and everything else kicking into play."

The National League's plea came after a wide-ranging BBC Sport interview with EFL chairman Rick Parry back in November when he accepted the need for change, commenting: "we have to acknowledge the need to look downwards as well as upwards". But as columnist Chris Dunlavy warned in our sister paper, The Football League Paper, last Sunday, finding support from EFL clubs will be far from easy.

“It’s only natural to ask why turkeys would vote for Christmas, and in the short-term it’s a logical argument. Nobody wants to make themselves more vulnerable to relegation,” Dunlavy writes.

“So precarious are finances throughout the EFL, however, that all but the biggest clubs could become a basket case, practically overnight. Remember Bolton, or Derby?

“There’s also a lot of money in Non-League, meaning the clubs who come up - like Stockport and Wrexham - tend to push the incumbents down.

That makes relegation at least a reasonable possibility for the majority of EFL clubs and means three-up, three-down is very much in their long-term interest.

“Unfortunately, that’s not how people operate. Which is why, without legislative intervention or a financial sweetener, the National League’s 3UP campaign is a non-starter.”

Shrewsbury Town manager Gareth Ainsworth agrees.

Speaking on BBC Radio 5 Live Sport’s 72+ EFL podcast last week, the former Wycombe Wanderers gave a rather damning indictment of the proposal, while voicing his annoyance at being unable to compete financially with wealthy clubs coming from Non-League such as Wrexham, Notts County and Chesterfield.

Ainsworth said: “Obviously, we’re not going vote for it. Who in the right mind in the EFL will be the vote for, you know, three down, three up?

“But that National League, believe me, very strong. And often the team that do come up. They compete well.

“And I think that’s a big argument point for them saying, look at your records, look at your Chesterfields of yours, look at your, you know, Stockports, you know.

“They’ve all kicked on, but it could kill some really, really big league teams. You know, you Oldhams and your Torquays. They’ve really found it difficult getting back in.

“Should we not look after our teams that you know, we keep going on about the teams that are struggling. We should look after our pyramid better.

“And the teams if a team just can’t keep up financially, but no other reason than the other teams have got billionaires coming in a million is that we it’s not fair that they just sink out the league and out of obscurity.

“So my argument would be, yes. These teams have done well, but have a look at the money that they’ve had invested in them as well.”
