A very warm welcome to Hill Farm Lane for tonight's Pitching In Isthmian South Central League game against Hayes & Yeading Football Club.

As we welcome our opponents to the club for our first competitive fixture with them, we have to pinch ourselves that we are actually running out against a club that has for years, been a significant name in non-league football. This Division is full of some real quality football clubs and we relish the opportunity to be playing these sides week after week.

It's been wonderful to see the Manager back at Hill Farm Lane after his absence away from the club - it's likely no coincidence that the result over the Met Police two weeks ago had something to do with Ross' surprising all of us by turning up that day. Before we all get ahead of ourselves, Andy and Bowes will be continuing to lead the team whilst the Manager finalises his treatment and recovery over the coming weeks.

On club matters, I am pleased to confirm that we have now finalised the date of our amazing Junior Summer Football Tournament over the weekend of the 31st May & 1st June. Please do make a note in your diary for this as we will need our club volunteers to step up again and support us running this hugely important club event. We will be sending out team invitations this week and hope to see all of the age groups from Binfield represented again this summer.

BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar.

We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the last two disruptive seasons, during the pandemic the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre. Our 1st season ever at Step 4, However the last season will of course be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2. In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, we finished 8th after a good start.

Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. Last season, we finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a reply by Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

Personally, it has been great for me to come back to the club, be a part of the games with my players, management team and see you all. Met Police FC at Home saw us win 1-0 with another goal from Rahzir Smith Jones. We were down to 10 men for nearly an hour, as Tyler was sent off with what was a poor first yellow by the ref and a second yellow before half time. I then made my presence known in the dressing room at half time and tactically set us up to be positive with 10 men to go and win the game, which is exactly what the players executed.

This week, we received performance of the month for January, from the Isthmian League, for our Quarter Final Win against Hastings United FC. A fantastic reward for the days off work the players took and the time we got back to Binfield! We left Binfield at 3pm to get the bus down to Hastings. On that journey I got a feel from the atmosphere, the players were up for it. Hastings did make some changes but only left out 3 starters, the rest had all featured many times for them this season in the League above. Our performance to a man, even the game changers that came on, were excellent. We fully deserved the win and it made that journey back much sweeter!

Our last fixture of January, saw us travel to Harrow Borough FC, a team we had already beaten twice this season. Our squad was missing some key players but it was an opportunity for some players to step up and take the shirts left by others. Unfortunately it took us 65 minutes to get going but by that time we were 4-0 down! Not the performance or consistency I asked for before the game! Another goal from Rahzir and all the other results going our way, was the biggest positives we could take away that afternoon!

Onto tonight, Hayes & Yeading FC are a sleeping giant of Non League football at our level. It's great to host a club of this magnitude to Binfield FC. Tonight we expect a very tough game, Hayes have a squad that could easily operate a league or 2 above us and will be there or there about this season, challenging for promotion. Hayes & Yeading FC will be a test I know my players have stood up to on numerous occasions this season, tonight is no different. Tonight's challenge presents an opportunity to show we can compete and a chance for my players to showcase their talents.

BINFIELD VS HAYES AND YEADING

We're gradually get more and more daylight as Spring draws closer but this evenings match will be played fully under the floodlights at the Iconic. A team chasing for those play off places against the Moles who have a pretty good home record in recent months. It should make for a competitive game at the Iconic.

The Moles three game win streak was brought to an end last Saturday with a tricky defeat at Harrow Borough. But prior to that, it was the best week for the Moles in Months. They booked their place in the Berks and Bucks Quarter Final with a 2-1 victory over Aylesbury Vale Dynamos and then picked up a victory in the league against Met Police despite a numerical disadvantage. The highlight of the week though was still to come with the 6-hour round trip at Hastings. Goals from Reese Jones Jr and Rahzir Smith-Jones booked the Moles spot in the Last 4 of the Velocity Cup, earning them the South Central Performance of the Month Award.

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

HAYES & YEADING UNITED

Hayes & Yeading United Football Club was created in May 2007 when the two clubs respective Chairmen, Derek Goodall and Philip Spurden agreed that the only way either club could continue, long term, at the level they were playing would be to join forces as a single entity.

Hayes FC was founded in 1909, as Botwell Mission, when Eileen Shackle, the teenage daughter of a wealthy land agent, encouraged the local youngsters to form a football team. The team was originally known as Botwell Mission, after the mission church that was built in memory of her grandfather, and that still stands today as part of the Hayes Library in Golden Crescent. Yeading FC was also founded with youth in mind beginning their existence in 1960 as Yeading Youth Club, started by brothers Ray and Carl Gritt.

By the time the two clubs were both in existence, Botwell Mission had changed its name to Hayes FC in June 1929 where having progressed through the Great Western Suburban League and the Spartan League they were then accepted into the Athenian League. In their first season at this level they reached the final of the FA Amateur Cup. This was notable for the fact that the club had started at the 1st qualifying round stage and had played all its nine matches away from home, travelling an estimated 1,500 miles to places as diverse as Wisbech, Trowbridge, Stalybridge (where Northern Nomads played), and York for a semi-final against Bishop Auckland. The final was lost to Wycombe Wanderers by one goal to nil. The Athenian League was won for the only time in season 1956-57 on goal average over Finchley and the semi-final of the Amateur Cup was reached, losing to Bishop Auckland before a crowd of 32,000 at St James Park, Newcastle.

While the sixties were pretty lean for Hayes FC, the newly formed Yeading FC were starting to get noticed at a junior level, having moved to Warren Park in 1965. As Uxbridge League Premier Division Runners up in 1967 Yeading moved into the newly formed West Middlesex Combination Premier Division and having notched a league and couple double that same season joined the South West Middlesex League. That first season (1968/69) Yeading won the West Drayton Charity Cup, and more prestigiously the Middlesex Junior Cup for the first time while also securing the Division One Title. Further promotion led to back-to-back South West Middlesex Premier Division titles and in 1970/71 Yeading also won both the Middlesex Junior and Intermediate Cups. During the 1970s they won the latter five times and the former twice.

In 1971/72 Hayes FC were elected to the Isthmian League while Yeading FC earned promotion to the Middlesex League seeing Championship success in their first season (1971/72), scoring a record 122 goals in the process. Season 1972/73 saw Yeading sweep all four trophies - League and Cup - in the Middlesex League while over at Church Road Hayes FC hit the headlines with an FA Cup first round defeat of Football League side Bristol Rovers before taking Reading to a second round replay.

The eighties saw Hayes FC maintain their Isthmian League status year on year without much danger of movement up or down while Yeading FC had started their climb upwards at no mean rate of knots. The Ding moved from the Middlesex League to the Spartan League going unbeaten through 1986/87 and earning promotion to the Isthmian League Division Two South in the process. The turn of the decade saw Yeading hit the national headlines when they became the first Middlesex side to lift the FA Vase, having drawn at Wembley, they travelled to Leeds' Elland Road where they secured a 1-0 victory over Bridlington Town.

Season 1992/93 saw Yeading's meteoric rise through the leagues reach the Isthmian Premier, the first time neighbours Hayes FC and Yeading FC were to become rivals. This rivalry was to last until 1996 when Hayes FC reached the pinnacle of non-league football by winning the Isthmian League championship by one goal in a nail-biting finale which also involved Enfield, Yeovil Town and Boreham Wood. The club maintained a presence at this level for six seasons, including finishing in 3rd place in 1998-9, before suffering relegation for the first time in 2002 at which time Yeading FC had dropped out of the Isthmian Premier so the renewal of rivalry would have to wait.

Hayes FC were to become one of the founder members of the Conference South League and were soon joined by neighbours Yeading FC, renewing the rivalry for a couple of seasons before the biggest sporting news the area had seen for many years.....

Hayes and Yeading United FC - Merged rivals.

After a season of consolidation, the newly merged side took many people by surprise in 2008/09 when a late season Conference South record equalling run of 10 consecutive victories saw a play-off place earned. Looking dead and buried at 4-0 down after 50 minutes of the semi-final first leg, only a dreamer would have predicted a place in the final. Dreams do come true though and two late first leg goals and a 4-0 extra time victory in the second leg at Eastleigh saw the final reached. A tight final ensued but Hampton & Richmond Borough were seen off by the odd goal in five and promotion was achieved to the pinnacle of non-league football, the Conference Premier. United more than held their own in the top flight for the first two seasons but with a much reduced budget and 5 years of ground sharing due to the late completion of the Club's new stadium, United hit the relegation trap-door in April 2012 and again in April 2016 and April 2017 before beginning its life in a new Stadium in 2017/18, losing the promotion play-off semi-final to Cambridge City at season end before a switch to the Isthmian League for 2018/19 saw United romp to the title and promotion with a 16 point advantage at season end. This was followed by two seasons being cancelled part way through due to the Covid-19 pandemic before a completed 2021/22 season saw United finish as runners-up only to fall at the final hurdle with a play-off final defeat. The 2022/23 season saw the Middlesex Senior Cup won for the first time with United just missing out on the play-offs, finishing in 7th position however a poor 2023/24 campaign under the new management of Ritchie Hanlon and then Mark Molesley put our position at step 3 in jeopardy with Andy Leese taking the helm just too late to avoid the drop to step 4.

Only six matches survived the rain, and they were short of goals, Ascot, Uxbridge, Guernsey and Rovers the only victors

Ascot United, in third, welcomed Harrow Borough. The Yellas had only one defeat from ten, had won five of their previous six, and defeated Borough three-nil in London earlier this season so went into this one as favourites, and showed why early on, Kickie Dzimba putting them ahead after just nine minutes. The next goal took a long time to arrive, until four minutes from time to be exact, and again it went to the hosts, Connor Holland making it two-nil- and that lifted them to within four points of the leaders.

Farnham Town and Kingstonian saw their matches postponed.

What looked very much like our match of the day, fifth place Uxbridge hosted sixth place Moneyfields. The travelling Moneys knew that they would go ahead of their hosts with victory despite starting the weekend three points behind, and they were very much our form team, going for a ninth successive victory- but they fell behind on twenty three minutes, James Taylor's smiling face quite clear to all watching on after he put the hosts ahead. The Moneys drew level fourteen minutes from time, Callum Laycock the scorer- but the last word went to the Red Army, who were delighted as Joshua Addae got the winner from the spot. Uxbridge climb to fourth, Moneyfields slip to seventh.

Raynes Park Vale travelled to Met Police, both sides boosted by midweek victories. Vale, with new boss Hayden Bird in the dug out, started the day four points away from the top five, whilst the Boys in Blue were three points above the drop zone and hoping to increase their margin for error. The first significant statistic saw a red card for the hosts Ryan Davey in the last minute, and that was the only significant statistic, nil-nil the final score. Vale climb to sixth nonetheless, Met are seventeenth, three points clear of the bottom four.

Hayes and Yeading United, in ninth place, were the hosts for Westfield, the visitors nine points and five places further back. United needed to get back to winning ways and to eat into the five point gap between themselves and fifth place, but they fell behind on sixteen minutes due to Manolis Gogonas scoring for the ninth time this season, six of which had come in his last seven matches. A red card six minutes from time for Malik Sesay saw the

visitors reduced to ten men, and that proved vital, as the ten men were breached four minutes into added time, Amos Nasha making it one-one. United are up to eighth, Westfield twelfth, a second one-one draw of the season between the two sides.

Leatherhead, in eleventh, headed to Horndean. The Tanners started the day ten points away from the top five but won't have given up hope just yet, particularly as they'd lost only one of their last ten- and they made the breakthrough just after the hour, Lukas Franzen-Jones the scorer, only seven minutes after emerging from the bench. The Deans had ended a six match winless streak with victory at Ashford Town on Sunday, and they drew level in this one thirteen minutes from time, Horatio Fowler doing his duty with their equaliser. That was how it ended.

South Park Reigate, one point above the bottom four, travelled to Carshalton to take on the side three points and three places behind them, Sutton Common Rovers. The hosts had a better goal difference than the Sparks so knew that they would will go above them with victory, and they went ahead early in the second half, Daniel Pepple with the goal. What they had, they held, and climbed to nineteenth, above their visitors on goal difference and two points from safety.

Guernsey welcomed Ashford Town to their Island, the sides separated only by goal difference, both only one point from safety at kick off. The Green Lions had seen their improved form stall with hammerings in their previous two, whilst the Tangerines had lost four of their previous five. The Tangerines one win from those five matches was one of the Green Lions hammerings, a five-nil win on January 21st- and they'd also won the last three times they had taken a plane to work- but Guernsey broke the deadlock in this one ten minutes into the second half, Ross Allen doing what he does best. That turned out to be the only goal, and it lifted Guernsey out of the bottom four, and two points clear of danger.

WALKING out onto the hallowed turf at Wembley is every young football fan's childhood dream. Dave Jones remembers it better than most.

When Atherton Laburnum Rovers chairman Shaun Lynch appointed a new manager 18 months ago, there were raised eyebrows among some observers given his chosen one was only 23 at the time. "Sometimes you have to give a lad a chance," he said.

And it's fair to say he has no regrets.

This afternoon, Jones will lead out his side at home to Bourne Town in the FA Vase last 16 in a game billed as LR's biggest knockout game since they reached the competition's semi-finals stage in 1994 - before Jones wasn't even born.

His side, the only Step 6 club still standing, hailing from North West Counties League's First Division North, have eliminated four teams from a higher level to get this far - including a thrilling 3-2 success against Hallam in the previous round secured by Ryan Talbot's last-gasp penalty.

"That moment is a perfect example of what this young group is about," he told The NLP this week.

"They're fearless, and they back each other. When they needed to show character, they did."

The same could be said for a club that has rallied from the brink of financial ruin five years ago when they were reprieved from relegation to a regional feeder league.

Jones, still just 25, has had a galvanising impact since taking charge and steered LR to second spot in the table last season.

They missed out on promotion through the play-offs, and occupied the same position entering this weekend - four points behind Nelson with four games in hand.

"When I came in, I wanted to reconnect the team with the town and give it an identity," said Jones, who prepares the pitch for National League high-fliers Altrincham as the Robins' head groundsman in his day job.

"You can feel the positive energy around the club as a result of this cup run, and those supporters who have been here through those tough times are really savouring the moment."

He plans to relay a similar message to his players before kick-off against a Bourne Town side currently leading the way in the United Counties League Premier Division North and involved at this stage for the first time ever in their 45th Vase campaign.

The LR boss added: "We didn't expect to do this well in the FA Vase, which is why it's important to enjoy the experience.

"Most lads in our dressing room won't probably won't get this far again, and I want us all to look back in 10 years' time and be able to say; 'they were good times, weren't they?'"

But Atherton LR and Bourne are not the only clubs looking to make history in this year's FA Vase. Half of the 16 clubs still standing are appearing in the fifth round for the first ever time - and there's also still a former winner looking to return to Wembley ten years after their last visit.

Northern League side North Shields host Whitchurch Alport for whom victory would match their best run to the quarter-finals from three years ago.

All 50 previous FA Vase finals have included a first time finalist - and this year looks to be no different.

Another former quarter-finalist is Crook Town, looking to repeat the feat from 19 years ago with a victory at Heanor Town - one of the eight clubs appearing in the fifth round for the first time.

VCD Athletic are in the fifth round for the first time in 18 years and they host Hellenic League leaders Hartpury University, while Whitstable Town have had a 28-year wait for the chance to reach the quarter-finals for the first time. They entertain a Fleet Town side who had never been beyond the second round before this season.

Egham Town travel to AFC Whyteleafe with the winner being a quarter-finalist for the very first time, while Erith & Belvedere are looking to match their best run to the quarter-finals from 10 years ago with victory over Daventry Town.

The Deres have won through six rounds already, via four penalty shoot-outs, having scored just four goals in normal time.

Conversely, Andover New Street, reinstated last week at the expense of Roman Glass St George, and their fellow Wessex League visitors, AFC Stoneham, have scored 28 goals between them in this season's Vase so far.

In the Trophy, all eyes are on Step 4 flag-flyers Sittingbourne, appearing at this stage of the competition for the first time in the club's 50th Trophy campaign - a competition record for the most campaigns before reaching the last 16.

The Step 4 Brickies travel to National League side Southend United in one of two ties that will see the winner setting their best Trophy run.

Worthing are into the last 16 for the first time in 39 years, and take on National League Rochdale, while Oxford City, of National League North, last went beyond the Last 16 four years ago. They take on twice beaten finalists National League side Forest Green Rovers.

A former multiple winner is Woking, who travel to the only Step 3 club still involved this season, Gainsborough Trinity, semi-finalists in 2013, while Spennymoor Town host Boston United 32 years after the Lincolnshire club knocked Spennymoor United out of the Trophy.

National League North side Kidderminster Harriers lifted the Trophy 38 years ago and they host Sutton United of the National League, while two-time winners Altrincham, face league rivals Eastleigh, who last reached the quarter-finals 11 years ago.

The final tie of the round sees two former semi-finalists face each other as National League Aldershot Town host Boreham Wood, from National League South, although it's 17 years or more since either side reached the last four.

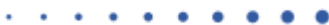
