BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar.

We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHIsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the last two disruptive seasons, during the pandemic the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre. Our 1st season ever at Step 4, However the last season will of course be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2. In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, we finished 8th after a good start.

Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. Last season, we finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a reply by Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

Good afternoon, today we host Raynes Park Vale FC and we wish everyone a warm welcome to the Iconic Stadium. I'd like to wish their management team, the players, all the officials and fans a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home after the game.

Following my last notes against Badshot Lea FC, where we drew 1-1, we also played Hartley Witney FC away, where we won 2-0 and Flackwell Heath FC in the Quarter Final, where we disappointingly didn't turn up, from a performance point of view & lost 5-0.

Our last home game at the Iconic Stadium v Badshot Lea FC, saw us give a lethargic performance & come away with a point. We scored first through Reese Jones Jr, we then took our foot of the gas & didn't execute the performance I know we are capable of, so a draw was probably a fair result, a point in the right direction on the League table.

Hartley Wintney FC away, saw us come away with 3 points, a clean sheet & 2 goals! Scored by Rechan Espirit & the potent Rahzir Smith-Jones. This performance epitomise's what the team is capable of when they apply themselves & execute what we are asking. The players must take huge credit for the work they put in that evening.

The win & 3 points have now taken us to 35 points, meaning we now have passed the 34 points we achieved last season, this is a positive step in the right direction & one collectively as a club we all should be very proud of, as we still have 12 league games to go after today & a League Cup Semi Final to look forward too. I plan to make sure we complete in every game from now until the end of the season.

On Tuesday we played our Berks & Bucks Quarter Final, where we lost 5-0, this was definitely a game we didn't compete in, which was very disappointing as a number of people worked very hard to get the game on, I'd like to thank them for their hard work to help get the game on at Sandhurst Town FC, meaning we don't have to play Saturday, Tuesday, Thursday & Saturday in the coming weeks, which is the positive I take away from the game. This will definitely be a reference point of how we can not perform moving forward.

Today we host Raynes Park Vale FC, who have just had a Manager change since our last fixture, with the experienced Hayden Bird taking the Managers hot seat. Hayden was the manager at Leatherhead FC last season, where he finished 3rd but failed in the playoffs. I know he'll be doing everything he can to go one step better this season with RVP FC. Hayden had assembled a whole new team from Leagues above, so today will be a very tough game for us. Following a tough performance Tuesday I am excited to see the response my team will give, especially in preparation for our Semi Final away to Billericay Town FC on Tuesday.

I hope you all enjoy the game today and thank you for your continued support.

BINFIELD VS RAYNES PALE VALE

The Moles are back playing their home games at the Iconic after their Berks and Bucks tie in Sandhurst on Tuesday. It will be another tough game against play-off chasing Raynes Park Vale this afternoon and hopefully we'll get the same entertainment as we did in the reverse fixture!



As far as the league is concerned, the Moles have found some form in recent weeks which has seen them climb to 11th in the form table. Initially they picked up points against teams below them in the table with a 3-1 win at Sutton Common Rovers before picking up a point at the Iconic to Badshot Lea. That point felt like a missed opportunity for the Moles but they responded brilliantly three days later with a 2-0 victory at Hartley Wintney. Rechan Esprit opening the scoring with a brilliant finish before Razvir Smith-Jones converted a late penalty to continue his scoring form. They will be disappointed with the way they exited the Berks and Bucks Cup on Tuesday evening to a good Flackwell Heath side and will be wanting to respond this afternoon.

Raynes Park Vale have been in and around the play-offs throughout the whole season. There has been a lot made of the personnel changes at the club but they haven't continued results on the pitch, losing only once in the league since November. They came from behind to earn three points at Horndean before a comfortable 4-1 victory at home to Southall where much of the work was done in the first half. A penalty from Daniel Hector before goals from Daniel Berry, Jaami Qureshi and Kyen Nicholas was enough to earn another win. To get into the play-offs they will need to bridge the current four point gap but you would certainly back them to be there at the end of the season.

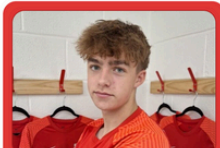

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

RAYNES PARK VALE

Raynes Park Vale FC was formed in 1995 following the merger of Raynes Park and Malden Vale (formed 1967).

Southern Railway Football Section 1925-1963

The first notable prominence of the football club in the Raynes Park community was as early as 1925 when Southern Railways Football Section was formed. The club was originally based at Raynes Park Sports Ground, Taunton Avenue, which is less than a mile away from the current club's home. The club played in the Surrey Senior League and were a part of a notable tour to Belgium to play fixtures against Ostend V.G. Club and Bruge FC in 1925. Little is known about these sides other than Railway had success in the 1932-33 Middlesex League and were also double winners in 1936, taking home both the Railway Athletic Association Cup and the Southern Railway Orphanage Cup. The Southern Railway Team fell victim to the notorious 1963 Beeching spending cuts, a national review into modernising the UK's railways. Southern Railways 1950s home kit was gold and green quarters, the company colours.

Malden Vale (1967-1995)

Malden Vale FC was founded in 1967 by the then Chairman Stephen Pearce. They spent their first decade of existence playing in the North Surrey Youth League, the Sunday Sportsman League, South Thameside League & the Surrey Combination League. Malden Vale won a total of 37 honours at junior & intermediate level. Malden Vale gained senior status in the 1977-78 season and was duly elected to the Surrey Senior League. Malden Vale have the honour of being the last ever winners of the Surrey Senior League in 1978 before the league vanished in a reorganisation and emerged as the London Spartan League. The following season the league changed its name to the Home Counties League. After one season in the newly named league, Malden Vale applied to join the London Spartan League a league in which they finished 4th twice and 2nd twice, including in 1984, when they lost out on the title to Hanwell Town on goal difference. Vale then left for the Combined Counties first incarnation and at the first attempt, won the title. The only league title on either side's resume. Ten seasons later in the 1988-89 season Malden Vale finished runners-up to BAE Weybridge in the Dan Air League and was promoted to the Diadora League Division 2 South. All of the club's members worked extremely hard to gain C Grade status for entry into the league. The club survived for 5 seasons in the Diadora Isthmian League. At the end of the successful 1993-94 season, managers Mick Brown and Ged Murphy left the club to join Hendon. Many of the players followed them and Malden Vale finished bottom of the table the following season.

Raynes Park Football Club (1964-1995)

Southern Railway Football Section eventually reformed a year following Southern Railway's deformation in 1964 as Raynes Park Football Club, also based at Taunton Avenue, SW20. Raynes Park FC home shirt colours were Red and Black stripes (similar to AC Milan) and specific testament to this was made by the newly formed Raynes Park Vale in the 2020-21 season where they played their home games in Red and Black Stripes for the first time since their formation in 1995. Raynes Park FC's alternative kit at the time was light blue shirts and white shorts. Raynes Park FC ran five senior teams on Saturday's, of which, the 1st and 2nd XI's played in the Surrey Premier League whilst the 3rd team played in the Surrey South Eastern Combination while the 4ths and 5ths played in the Kingston and District League. They also ran an over 35's team and youth teams aged 14 to 18.

Raynes Park Vale (1995-present day)

The new merged club immediately joined the Combined Counties Football League and currently play in the league's Premier League, Tier 9 in the national league pyramid. Their best finish was in 1997-98 when they finished in fourth place at tier 9. They have participated in both national Cup competitions apart from a brief period at the start of the 2000s. [1]

The club's reserve team won the Combined Counties Reserve League in 2002-03 and 2005-06 before it joined the Suburban League for the 2006-07 season. The reserve team was disbanded for financial reasons before rejoining the combined counties reserve league for the 2011-12 season under the management of Terry Tuvey. In the 2012-13 season the reserves achieved the League and Cup double. The Cup was won with a 2-0 win against Worcester Park Reserves in the final. The Reserves also won the fair Play award in both 2011-12 and 2012-13, the 1st team winning the Premier award in 2011-12. The combined counties league took the decision to disband the reserve league at the end of the 2012-13 season so for the 2013-14 season they have re-joined the Suburban League. Midway through 2013-14 Lee Dobinson stepped down as 1st Team Manager to take over as Club Chairman from Fred Stevens. Former AFC Wimbledon Player Gavin Bolger stepped up to take over as 1st team Manager. Gavin Bolger played 107 times for AFC Wimbledon from 2002 to May 2005 scoring 27 goals from midfield. [2] Following the conclusion of the 2020/21, Gavin Bolger and his assistant manager Reece Turner stepped down from their roles, later deciding to join Tooting Bec Football Club.

Preceding the start of the 2021/22 season, Josh Gallagher was appointed as First Team Manager, accompanied by Anthony Panayi (Assistant Manager), Daniel Canning (Goalkeeper coach & Physio)

and Chris Williams (Strength and Conditioning). Raynes Park Vale finished the season in 3rd place behind Beckenham Town and Walton & Hersham F.C.

The 2022-23 season concluded with a Raynes Park Vale double as the 1st team were crowned Combined Counties Premier South League champions on 99 points, with second placed Badshot Lea also promoted. Raynes Park Vale were promoted to the Isthmian League - South Central Division. The U18 team under manager Terry Savage won 13 of 16 games to land the 2022-23 Combined Counties League Tony Ford U18 East title trophy.

K's and Lane score five, Hayes get four, Villa and Met each get three, whilst Farnham and Southall win with two on South Central Saturday

Farnham Town's win over Kingstonian on Wednesday night didn't just give them a nine point lead at the top, the manner of it shouted "catch us if you can" to the rest of the promotion hopefuls. Town were back on their own patch hoping to make that lead even bigger, but they had what appeared to be a tough challenge in prospect as Leatherhead made the trip, the Tanners having defeated these opponents four-one in October. It certainly didn't look all that tough, however, when first Adam Liddle and then Jordan Gallagher made it two-nil before the first half of the first half had been completed, but the scoring stopped there until stoppage time at the end of the match, when Ruben Bartlett-Antwi got a goal back for the visitors. Farnham hold onto their nine point lead.

Kingstonian needed to quickly bounce back from their midweek misery, and they travelled to face a side who have had enough recent misery of their own, third bottom Sutton Common Rovers. The K's were quickly ahead, Stan Flaherty opening the scoring after ten minutes, and Flaherty struck again just before the break to ensure his side had a two-nil lead at half time. Twelve minutes from the end Eddie Simon made it three, but Rovers quickly got one back, Michael Konan the scorer. That simply provoked the visitors, however, and Simon added two more to claim the match ball and seal a five-one win. Rovers are six points from safety, and have now conceded right goals to the K's this season.

Third place Ascot United started the weekend a point behind Kingstonian and ten points behind the leaders. The Yellas hosted what looked to be our match of the day, fourth place Uxbridge- a point behind- making the trip to the Racecourse Ground, but it didn't live up to that billing. The first notable statistic was a red card for the Yellas Joe Gate nine minutes from time, and as it turned out that was the last notable statistic, too. The sides remain third and fourth.

Seventh place Hayes and Yeading United welcomed the side one place and one point behind them, Moneyfields. With a seven/eight point gap to make up on fifth place, this match looked important for the promotion aspirations of both sides, and United were looking to go eight unbeaten- but having drawn four of their previous seven three points this time looked a must. They went ahead after twenty three minutes, Kayla Hinds with the opening goal, but the Moneys were quickly level, Harry Sargeant equalising eight minutes before half time. Just before the hour George Sippetts made it two-one to the hosts, and almost immediately an own goal made it three-one.

The Moneys weren't finished, and a penalty from Jordan Pile brought it back to three-two and left them fourteen minutes to find an equaliser, but the next goal didn't arrive until seven minutes into added time, and it went to the hosts, Adrian Clifton with it, four-two the final score.

Hayes stay seventh, the visitors drop to ninth.

Hanworth Villa, in ninth at kick off, travelled to face Harrow Borough, two places and two points behind, both sides needing victory to keep their play off hopes alive. Villa had won three of their previous four, whilst Borough had lost three of their previous four, so perhaps the visitors were favourites- and they went ahead after eleven minutes, Sam Merson keeping his cool from the spot. Merson struck again just before the break- but there was somehow time for Mack Miskin to immediately get a goal back, one-two as they all trudged off for a half time orange. Rayners Lane, big winners in Guernsey last weekend, were back in West London, Horndean their visitors as fourteenth plays thirteenth. Lane went ahead just before the half hour, Germaine Dua opening the scoring, and quickly added a second, Frank Keita scoring for the twenty fifth time this season. Early in the second half Deshane Dalling made it three, although the Deans Robert Taw quickly got one back. Keita made it four-one with twenty five minutes left, and three minutes from time Dalling added a fifth, making it ten Lane goals for the week and lifting them above their visitors in the table.

South Park Reigate, three points above the drop zone at kick off, were hoping for a third win in a row- and perhaps a third clean sheet- as they welcomed Southall, but their chances of a clean sheet departed just before the hour when Makael Scott put The All ahead. Thirteen minutes from time a red card for JJ O'Sullivan saw the hosts reduced to ten men, and a minute from time they conceded a second goal, Jordi Ebanda making it two-nil.

Met Police, three points above the drop zone, welcomed second bottom Ashford Town to Imber Court. The Tangerines were seven points from safety and have lost six of their previous seven, whilst the Boys in Blue had only one defeat from six, but had only won one of those, four of them ending level. The hosts were hoping to do the double over their visitors, who they defeated two-one the last time they met, and they went ahead on the half hour through Sydney Gbla only for Basim Mirtahmasebi to level five minutes later. Three minutes from time George Vorster looked to have earned the visitors three points, but somehow the boys in blue had time not only to equalise but to score a winner, Gbla scoring both of them to claim the match ball and allowing his side to open up a six point gap between themselves and the bottom four.

TWO rounds from gracing the hallowed turf at Wembley Stadium, it's perfectly natural to assume that players from the 16 clubs competing in this weekend's Isuzu FA Trophy and Vase quarter-finals are getting pretty twitchy right now.

So, as a football manager, the question is how do you channel those nerves, excitement, and perhaps a tinge of anxiety, into a winning mentality? Is it possible to keep emotions in check and feet on the ground?

Well, as Hartpury University manager Dr Martin Longworth told me this week, the answer is with great difficulty.

Dr Longworth's entire Hartpury squad are made up of current students aged between 16 and 25 with dreams of a lasting football careers, and they're making a pretty good fist of it so far, sitting pretty on top of the Hellenic League Premier Division table on the back of a 27-game unbeaten run stretching back to September.

"It's really hard to keep a 16-18-year-old's feet on the ground when you're two rounds from Wembley and we haven't shied away from that," Dr Longwell said.

"We've made it very clear that that could happen, there's no point hiding from it - it's good motivation for us.

"Yes, you've got to take each game as it comes but, ultimately, we are potentially two rounds from Wembley."

Hartpury's two-game mission starts this afternoon when Southern Counties East League side Erith & Belvedere are the visitors to the Hartpury University Stadium they share with the Rugby Championship club of the same name.

Many people's favourites for the Vase, Dr Longwell's men have won all four of their matches 1-0 to get to this stage, could history repeat itself all the way to the semi-finals this afternoon.

In the other three quarter-final ties, Southern Counties East League play-off chasers Whitstable Town take on Whitchurch Alport, of the Midland Football League, while bookies' favourites AFC Whyteleafe, of the Combined Counties Premier South, take on United Counties League Premier North opponents Bourne Town.

Re-instated Andover New Street, reprieved by Roman Glass St George fielding an ineligible player, complete the line-up with the Wessex League side hosting United Counties League side Heanor Town, making the last eight for the first time in their history.

The Isuzu FA Trophy is just as intriguing.

Story of the season, undoubtedly, are Step 4 Isthmian League Division One South East club Sittingbourne FC.

Not only are the Brickies the last non-National League club standing, but they have also won through eight ties, scoring 18 goals along the way.

During that run, Ryan Maxwell's side have beaten SIX teams on higher standing, including away at National League Southend United in the last round.

According to our friends at @FATrophyFactfile, their run to the last eight in the club's 50th FA Trophy campaign, is a competition record.

This lunchtime, Sittingbourne host National League Aldershot Town for whom a victory would equal their best Trophy performances to the semi-finals, last achieved 17 years ago.

Since the original Aldershot FC were formed 99 years ago, the club has never reached a Wembley final.

Elsewhere, the Shots' local rivals, and three times former Trophy winners, Woking, travel to National League North opponents Oxford City who are equalling their best Trophy run from four years ago.

The Hoops will be looking to make it third time lucky against Woking in the FA Trophy having twice exited the competition at the hands of The Cards in the past.

The only other National League North club still involved are looking to prevent their opponents from avenging a past Trophy defeat. Spennymoor Town travel to National League side and 1980-81 Trophy finalists, Sutton United, hoping to replicate their 3-0 victory over the Us from six years ago.

And in the only all-National League affair, Rochdale, in just their second Trophy campaign, host an Altrincham side aiming to try to lift the Trophy for the third time in the club's history.

One thing's for sure, they'll be 16 squads of players going hell for leather this afternoon in a bid to get one step closer to Finals Day on Sunday May 11.

As the great Ossie Ardiles sung during Tottenham Hotspur's FA Cup song back in 1981, 'Ossie's Going To Wembley, His Knees Have Gone All Trembly'.

If the Vase and Trophy hopefuls aren't nervous and excited enough this weekend, they'll be plenty of trembly knees on the terraces, that's for sure.


