BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up

to our 1st Team We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 Uhlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.







Good evening, tonight we host Rayners Lane FC and we wish everyone a warm welcome to the Iconic Stadium. I'd like to wish their management team, the players, all the officials and fans a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home after the game.

It's been 11 days since our last home game, where we played Ashford Town FC, where we lost in a tight game 1-0, which was frustrating. We also had 2 away games on the road, where we drew 2-2 to Westfirld FC and beat Met Police FC 2-1 on Saturday.

The Ashford Town FC game was frustrating, we didn't perform to the levels I know this team can achieve. The officials on the night were very poor, to the point, I have watched the game back and Hilts scored a perfectly good goal which was disallowed for offside, where the assistant official flagged quickly for offside, then put it down and then the ref blew for offside. I don't believe the officials cost us the result, as our levels weren't quite at it, however, they got this BIG decision wrong, which definitely cost us a point.

Last Tuesday we travelled to Woking to play Westfield FC, always tough opponents and you can clearly see why they are mid table and pushing up the league, as they have some very experienced players for this level. I was delighted that we matched them physically and tactically on the night. To come back twice in the game, shows the character and personality is still in the team, which was shown in full when Dan Lewis' desire to score at the far post to get a point, this is the exact energy this team needs to continue to show. It's great to see Ethan Lindo back scoring goals, he took his goal so well from a great pass from Mitch.

Saturday we travelled to Hampton, London, never the easiest journey but it was great to see the team arrive early, which reflected on how we started the game, on the front foot and creating chances from KO. Ethan Lindo again on the score sheet with a cute finish, after a great weighted pass from Rechan. 1-O soon became 2-O, as Rahzir added to his tally with a volley from a Luke Wayborn long throw.

I believe had we been more clinical, we could've easily gone in 3 to 4-0 up, as Ethan, Reese and Rahzir all had good chances. The wind clearly played a factor in the game, as it really was a game of 2 halves, as they came out scored early, however, it was great to see the desire in our defending as a team to get the win.

Last Thursday, it was Transfer deadline day! Always a busy day for a Manager! Not ideal for me, as I had to be in Hospital late in the afternoon for treatment on my eye, thankfully, all our business was done by that point. Unfortunately for us, we lost Tyler D'Cruz to Leatherhead FC, who was offered a ridiculous financial offer and I couldn't stand in his way, I wish him well, he's been a great signing for me at Binfield FC and we certainly shared some memorable football experiences together. I don't believe it will be the last time we see Tyler in a Red Mole's shirt. Rahzir Smith-Jones also signed a dual-reg agreement with Basingstoke Town FC. In more positive news, I am delighted Kai MacKenzie has joined us from AFC Wimbledon, Erick Keiko has joined us from the Ballers League, where he is playing for Santan FC. A big thank you to Adam Hopkins, for his support with dual-registrations for the following players from Holyport FC - Callum Wright, Logan Coles and Lynford Sackey. All in all, a busy end to the week but a productive one, as we prepare for the last final month of the season.

Tonight presents our second game with Rayners Lane in 2 weeks. We lost our last game away to them at Bedfont Sports FC, in a game where my team didn't turn up, which disappoints me even writing that! Tonight the team will be fully prepared to present themselves correctly, my management team and myself will be doing everything to make sure this happens

As we are now in the final month of the season, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for your support to me personally and the Team so far this season, we have created some great moments already, lets stick together for the final month and finish the season strong. Enjoy the game tonight.

The Moles are continuing to battle right to the end of the season. After losing three games in a row fort he first time under Ross Weatherstone's reign, their response has been typical of their revival over the past year. Facing a midweek trip away to Westfield, the Moles came from behind twice to earn a valuable point - including a Dan Lewis goal from off the bench!

On Saturday, the Moles travelled to Met Police knowing three points would all-but secure their Isthmian League status for another season. And the Moles were out to prove a point from Rechan Esprit led a Moles counter attack and found Ethan Lindo who slotted the ball into the back of the net to give the Moles the lead inside ten minutes. INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS RAYNERS LANE FC

Rayners Lane FC was originally founded in Harrow, Middlesex, in 1933 and spent their formative years playing in local football. By the early 1960's they had joined the Spartan League, a tenth spot finish in 1966-67 their highest placing. In 1978-79 they had joined the Hellenic League and they were crowned Division 1 champions on goal difference in 1982-83, earning promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division where they stayed for eleven seasons before lack of floodlights saw the club returned to Division 1. Two seasons in Hellenic Division 1 were followed by two seasons in the Middlesex League before they joined the Chiltonian League Premier Division in 1998-99.

The Chiltonian and Hellenic Leagues merged in 2000-01 and Rayners Lane found themselves in Division 1 East which they won in 2012-13. However, they were denied promotion due to ground grading issues and stayed in Division 1 until the 2017-18 season when they moved to the Spartan South Midlands Division 1. That summer work began on installing a 3G playing surface along with a new club house and the Tithe Farm Sports & Social Club was eventually opened in October 2019. A year later long time club stalwart Tony Pratt was recognized by the FA with Volunteer Of The Year Award for over 50 years of service, a fine achievement for both the club and Tony.

The club remained in the Spartan South Midlands League until the 2021-22 campaign when restructuring by the FA saw them moved over to the Combined Counties League Division 1. A fourth place finish saw them reach the Play-Offs where they lost in the semi-final to eventual winners Wallingford Town. The following season saw them again finish fourth which resulted in another Play-Off spot where this time they overcame London Samurai Rovers in the semi-final and then Langley in the final to earn promotion. They also beat British Airways FC to win the Middlesex Premier Cup to chalk up a first ever League and Cup double.

2023-24 saw Rayners Lane under the stewardship of Gary Meakin and Wes Daly and they won promotion from CCL Premier North via the Play-Offs and also became the first Step 5 side to win the Middlesex Senior Cup with a memorable victory over Hayes & Yeading United. The 2024-25 season sees The Lane competing at Step 4 for the first time in their history.

TIME flies when you're having fun and that's certainly the case here at The NLP. On Wednesday, March 26 we celebrated our 25th anniversary since the paper hit the newsstands.

In the years since, we've been lucky enough to have a front row seat to the heartbeat of English football.

We've seen an increased profile of this level of the game, a jump in professionalism, more than one restructure of the Pyramid and written about countless teams, players, managers, clubs, grounds - and results!

Stuart Pearce implored top clubs to unearth Non-League treasures on the front cover of The NLP's first ever edition - and what good advice it has proved!

The England legend famously took that path himself, beginning at Wealdstone before going onto have a decorated career at the very top of the English game.

Pearce joined the Essex Senior League's Non-League Day groundhop last weekend to see the impact of the Premier League's Stadium Fund, which has distributed more than £207 million in grants to over 1,000 men's and women's clubs throughout the English Football League, National League and football pyramid.

The fund, like The NLP, is celebrating its 25th anniversary and Pearce smiled when looking back at issue one of The Non-League Paper.

"It's incredible - and 25 years later Dan Burn walks out in an England shirt," Pearce told The NLP. "That's a great point in case. A lot of players get released from academies and it can diminish their spirit but it shouldn't necessarily do that.

"In fact - and I got released from QPR as a 13-year-old - it should inspire you to prove people wrong.

"I think all of football was delighted to see Dan Burn arrive in an England shirt. For what he's doing for his club, a hometown boy if you like, and his pathway, it sends a great message out to youngsters that you don't have to be a superstar to start with. If you're determined, dogged, then you've got every opportunity."

Kevin Ellison was on target the weekend The Non-League Paper was launched...and he's still doing the business for Step 4 Vauxhall Motors now at the age of 46!

The then-winger was on target for the Robins in a 1-1 draw with Kettering Town, one of the final points they picked up that season.

Ellison excelled, earning a move to Premier League Leicester City a year later, but a late slump saw Alty relegated after a season back in the Nationwide Conference.

"I'd have rather not had a good season and we stayed up," Ellison told The NLP.

"Getting back into the English pyramid was a big thing for me then, I'd been playing in the League of Wales.

"Altrincham gave me that great opportunity to go pro. I owe them a lot. You dream of it as a little boy.

"It didn't happen for me when I was younger because clubs were telling me I wasn't good enough, then five or six years ago they were bidding for me when they could have had me for free!"

Ellison recalls how keeping track of his career was a bit different at the turn of the century. "I used to get the Manchester Pink and the Liverpool Echo, my regional North West papers," he said. "My mum used to cut out write-ups on me.

"It was probably harder then for your ability to get recognised.

"Look at how many lads are uploading YouTube clips now? We didn't have that then, but that's not a negative.

"I'm fortunate to have played in old school football and the fast paced tempo game now.

"People will say the game was a bit slower then but it felt like it was more 'proper' football.

"Has the game changed for the better? Who knows.

"You should never forget your roots, even when I was in League Two I was still picking up my copy of The Non-League Paper."

Thanks Kev and to everyone else who has supported us through the years. Here's to the next 25 years!
