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BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

LEATHERHEAD

LEATHERHEAD FOOTBALL CLUB can trace its history back to the formation of Leatherhead Rose in 1907. Rose were crowned Champions of the Dorking & District League in 1910 and 1919 before joining the Kingston and District League where they won the League title three times, the last in 1938-39. Leatherhead United were formed in 1924 and, in 1925-6, won Division One of the Sutton and District League. In the early 1930s, United joined the Surrey Junior League becoming Champions in 1933-4. After the War, officials of the two clubs met and in May 1946, Leatherhead Football Club was officially formed at a public meeting. United's Fetcham Grove ground was to be used as the home ground. The Tanners went on to win four consecutive Surrey Senior League Championships before spells in the Metropolitan, Delphian and Corinthian Leagues. Tanners were Corinthian League champions in 1963 before moving into the Athenian League. Leatherhead won promotion from Division One at the end of the first season and inaugurated their floodlights with a match against a Fulham side. Leatherhead won the Surrey Senior Cup for the first, and to date, only time in 1969.

After being elected in to the Isthmian League, Leatherhead made national headlines in 1974-5 when they reached the Fourth Round proper of the FA Cup, defeating League sides Colchester Utd and Brighton & Hove Albion before bowing out to First Division Leicester City 2-3. In subsequent seasons, the Tanners defeated two more Football League sides at the Grove – Cambridge United and Northampton Town.

After the disappointment of defeat in FA Amateur Cup semi-finals in 1971 and 1974, the Tanners finally reached Wembley Stadium in 1978 but were beaten in the FA Trophy Final. The Club then entered a period of decline and were relegated in 1983 and in 1990, slipped down into Division Two South but were back in Division One in 1997. Finances were a problem and in the summer of 2000 the club was within a few days of folding but was saved by its supporters who took over following a crisis meeting.

In 2006-7, Leatherhead were the lowest ranked team to reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing 1-2 at Football League side, Torquay United. Mick Sullivan was appointed First Team Manager in May 2009. Under Sullivan's guidance, the club had its most successful season in years, winning the Isthmian League Cup (the first major trophy for some 40 years) and finishing the season in fifth place in the League before losing a play-off semi-final. The following season, a dramatic play-off

victory against Dulwich Hamlet (4-3 after extra time), saw The Tanners return to the Premier Division for the first time since 1983. Tanners stay lasted just the one season though. In 2013-14 Tanners reached the play offs again, this time edging out Guernsey 3-2, before winning a penalty shootout at Folkestone Invicta to return to the Ryman Premier Division.

Sammy Moore was appointed in the summer of 2017. In his first managerial job Sammy steered Tanners to the second round of the FA Cup, a County Cup Final and a top eight finish in the League before departing for Concord Rangers along with the majority of the team. He was replaced by former Margate boss Nikki Bull who, despite having to rebuild the squad, took the team to an 8th place finish narrowly missing out on the play-offs. After a poor start to the 2021-22 season Luke Tufts was appointed manager in January 2022, but was unable to steer the club out of the relegation places, although from a seemingly impossible position it was very close.

After an indifferent start to 2022-23 Hayden Bird was appointed to the Fetcham Grove hot seat in October. He led Tanners to the play-off final in 2024 but Marlow prevailed in the final. At the start of the current season Ian Selley was appointed as manager.

Leatherhead, Villa, Hayes, Yellars, Row, K's, Field and Hendon are our South Central winners- whilst Sports Cup run comes to a heroic end

Each of our matches today was preceded by a minute of silence in memory of Chichester City's Billy Vigar, who sadly passed away earlier this week. We'd like to once more send our condolences- and indeed the condolences of all of our clubs- to Billy's family and friends, and to all at City.

Leaders Leatherhead got back to winning ways in the FA Trophy last weekend, but they hadn't won a league match since the end of August. That said, they'd only played two since then, prior to the arrival of Hornden! At half time it looked as if that winless run was going to continue as the Deans were two up, Ryan Carroll on four minutes and Michael O'Connell on forty five doing the damage, but the Tanners hit back hard after the break. Mark Waters quickly got a goal back, George Hedley levelled sixteen minutes from time, and almost immediately Anas Igozouln completed the turnaround. Three-two Tanners, who are two points clear at the top.

Second place Raynes Park Vale had the chance to go top in midweek, but Hayes & Yeading United put a halt to their three match unbeaten run. Vale were at home to fifth place Littlehampton Town in our South Central match of the day, the travelling Golds three matches unbeaten and having won their last two by three goals to two- and the two sides delivered a thriller. Littlehampton went ahead on seven minutes, Horsham loanee Freddie hammond the scorer, and Hammond added a second just before the break- but next came a Vale fightback. Kareem Akinnibi halved the deficit on sixty four minutes, and almost immediately Calvin Ekpiteta found an equaliser. The Golds weren't happy with that, and David Herbert quickly restored their lead from the spot, and it looked like that would be that, but eight minutes into added time Ekpiteta earned his side a point- nine minutes after the visitors went down to ten men with a red card from Kyle O'Brien.

Third place Hanworth Villa had suddenly found their form, which might have worried visitors Bognor Regis Town, who seemed to have lost theirs. The Villains had won three in a row and scored eleven goals in the process, whilst the travelling Rocks found themselves second from bottom, and without a win since opening day. Villa went ahead on eighteen minutes, Sam Merson the scorer, but it seemed as if the Rocks had taken a point when Dan Gifford levelled four minutes from time. Villa, however, had other ideas, and two minutes into added time were awarded a penalty, George Wells keeping calm to slot home for two-one. That's eight defeats from nine in all competitions for the visitors.

Hayes and Yeading United welcomed AFC Portchester to the Skyex. United started the day in top form, having won six in a row in all competitions, including their last five at home- and that's now seven and six! Kaylen Hinds put the hosts ahead on sixteen minutes, Sam Ashton made it two just before the break, and Ryan Ewhare got a third just before the hour. The visitors got a late consolation through Brett Pitman, and saw their hosts reduced to ten men with a red card for substitute Didi Ndombe, but that was that.

Ascot United, in sixth, were at home to a side who were behind them only on goal difference, Harrow Borough. The Yellas had played seven matches at their Racecourse Ground this season and won six of them, so the home crowd was full of confidence- and they were right to be. Borough went ahead nine minutes before the break, Lenny Farhall continuing his fine scoring form, but that simply roused the hosts, who delivered a second half blitz. Jaheim Kamara levelled a minute into the second half, Luis Le Paih got number two fifteen minutes from time, Joden Trickett made it three-one with eight minutes left, and there was still time for Andrio Brandao to add a fourth. The Yellas climb to fifth.

Met Police were the hosts for Egham Town. The Boys in Blue had really found their feet, with only one defeat in seven in all competitions coming into this one, whilst the Sarnies picked up their first League win of the season in midweek and had lost only one of five in League and Cups. Those statistics suggested that this one would be close, and indeed it was. The match can perhaps be categorised as the Jamal Sharpe and Luke Heneghan show, as the former scored twice in the first half for Met, and the latter scored twice in the second half for Town, two-two the final score.

South Park Reigate welcomed Hartley Wintney to Whitehall Lane. The Sparks, in eleventh as we kicked off, were a point behind their visitors but had lost four of their previous five- and now that run is five from six, The Row taking the points. The only goal of the match arrived eighteen minutes from time, Alex Body scoring it.

Kingstonian travel to Fareham Town. The K's had been both very good and rather poor so far this season, the epitome of inconsistency- but they were very much the former on this occasion, sweeping their hosts away. Ethan Lindo and Dennis Kelmendi made it two-nil to the visitors within ten minutes, Ethan Lindo added a third seven minutes from time, and the K's are up to eighth.

Finally Westfield were at home to bottom side Southall. Field had been very good at home, and indeed hadn't lost at Woking Park since opening day- that was five unbeaten home matches with four wins- and they confirmed another three points and more misery for The All. Tom Dryer scored just before and just after half time for Field, and a goal from Anthony O'Connor fifteen minutes from time wasn't enough to earn anything for the visitors, who played most of the match with ten men after a red card for Eoin Fraser six minutes before the break.

Emirates FA Cup Third Qualifying Round

Bedfont Sports hosted Slough Town. Sports had defeated Guernsey, Kingstonian, Littlehampton Town and Hanwell Town to reach this stage, and had five wins from five at home, but sadly they couldn't make it six. They went ahead on nineteen minutes, Ollie Davidson the scorer, but the visitors levelled just before the break, went ahead on the hour, and, despite some Sports pressure, held on to win.

THERE can't be many clubs with a better record of producing players fit for the EFL - and higher - than FC Halifax Town.

The number that have passed through the Shay down the years is quite something.

Our Chris Dunlavy, chief writer on sister title The Football League Paper, caught up with a former Shaymen last week after he called time on his career.

One of the privileges of this job is watching young footballers thrive in Non-League before getting their chance and then carving out a successful career in the higher levels.

Lee Gregory certainly did that, scoring 112 EFL goals for the likes of Millwall, Stoke, Sheffield Wednesday and Mansfield Town.

The striker began his journey at Staveley Miners Welfare and Sheffield FC and Glapwell before ripping it up at FC Halifax Town - alongside a certain Jamie Vardy.

But Gregory still remembers the conversation he had with Nicky Law during a brief spell on trial at Alfreton two decades ago.

"I was 17 or 18 and Nicky was the manager at Alfreton," he recalls. "He said to me one day, 'You don't have to be a professional. You can have a good career in Non-League. Get a job, do this on the side, put the extra money towards a house and you'll pay it off in 15 or 20 years'.

"I remember thinking 'You know, he's right'. That was my mentality when I was playing for Staveley Miners Welfare and Sheffield FC and Glapwell.

"By the time I got to 23, when I joined Halifax, I was like 'OK, this is my life - let's buy that house and stop dreaming'."

Thankfully for Gregory, now 37, an intervention from Kim Holloway - wife of Ian - changed the course of his life.

Gregory scored 29 National League goals for Halifax in the 2013-14 campaign. Holloway, then in charge of Millwall, was considering making an offer but feared the forward would struggle with the jump to the Championship.

"You could be the best player in the world but if you've not got the right opinion behind you, you're not going to go anywhere," says Gregory.

"It only takes one person to believe in you and in my case it was Ian's wife. She was the one who said 'Go on, why don't you take a chance on the lad from Non-League?' That one opinion changed my life.

"I did have other clubs in the pipeline. I was always going to end up in the EFL that summer. But none of them were in the Championship. I know you make your own luck, but you need help along the way. I was very lucky that she said that to him, and that he listened to her."

Gregory is just another example of how different players will take different routes into the Football League. We're lucky we get to see a lot of them at before they really make it.
