# BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

Well the Moles are back in action at Hill Farm Lane as we welcome Bognor Regis Town. Rarely heard at this time of the year, the Moles have had a couple of weeks off due to international team commitments but they'll need to be on it straight away against a tough Rocks side.



The Moles headed into their mini-break off the back of one of their performances of the season at Raynes Park Vale. It was a performance filled with character and spirit with bodies being thrown on the line when required before Amari Fashanu got the pivotal goal to separate the two sides. It's not the first time that the Moles have taken points off teams at the top of the table but the challenge now is to back that up in the weeks to come and put a string of results together which they will be looking to continue today.

We had three Bermudans who were called up to the senior side for World Cup Qualifiers against Curacao and Trinidad & Tobago. Aunde Todd started both games including a 2-2 draw against Trinidad & Tobago. Rahzir Smith-Jones came off the bench against Curacao while CJ Fubler gained more brilliant experience being in-and-around his national side.

Our visitors arrive at Hill Farm lane having made a solid start to their Isthmian League campaign with 23 points from their opening 17 matches. After a slow start, they have lost just twice in their last nine matches - scoring plenty of goals in the process. After going a goal behind last Saturday, they earned a point against Egham Town through Lennie Smith - a team that will be fighting with them for those play-off spots at the end of the season.

## RAYNES PARK VALE 0-1 BINFIELD

### Fashanu and the Moles stun the Vale

Amari Fashanu's second half effort tops off one of the Moles' performances of the season as they see off Raynes Park Vale.

As the Moles travelled the third place Raynes Park Vale, few would have seen them walking away with all three points to earn just their second league victory away from home this season. In a performance described as a 'smash and grab' by the Vale manager, it was anything but with the main difference being in the two boxes - a term that has been used against the Moles a few times this season but it was them that were the clinical ones today.

They had the ball in the back of the net twice during the second half only for Lamin Ceesay to be adjudged offside to deny him a goal on his Moles debut. Natty Boakye and Ceesay both had opportunities to put the Moles ahead in the first half but neither could find the target while the Vale's closest effort was a looping effort from outside the box the just went over the crossbar.

They made a much-improved start to the second half forcing CJ Fubler into two saves immediately after the restart. They looked certain to take the lead just after the hour mark but some big blocks by Harvey Griffiths and Kyle Daniel-Spray maintained the Moles' clean sheet.

Then with 20 minutes to go, the Moles sprung back into life. They had a goal ruled out through Ceesay but three minutes later came the big moment in the match. Daniel-Spray's cross-field ball was flicked on by Kicke Dzimba into the path of Fashanu. He drove at the Vale goal and squeezed the ball in from a tight angle for his fifth goal of the season. They could've added a second but Boakye couldn't far the far corner from a tight angle.

They came under pressure towards the closing stages but Fubler, in truth, wasn't really tested. If anyone were to question how much it meant to the Moles, the full time scenes tell a story. After another block from the combined Nathan Jones and Dan Lewis, the full time whistle blew which was followed by elation and a big embrace from the centre back partnership as the Moles will look to kick on.

# INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

## BOGNOR REGIS TOWN

They won the championship of this league for five successive years in the early 1920s, after which they joined the Brighton & Hove District League in 1926. Just one year later, however, they joined the Sussex County League where they were to remain until 1972. The club became Bognor Regis F.C. in 1929 after King George V added the suffix 'Regis' to the seaside resort.

The club won the Sussex County Division One championship in the 1948-49 season. At the end of that season, they added "Town" to their name so as not to be confused with the local rugby club.

At the end of the 1969-70 season they were relegated, but won Division Two at the first attempt. The club won the Division One championship title the following season and were promoted to Division One South of the Southern League. In 1972-73 they reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time, losing 6-0 at Colchester United. In 1976 Jack Pearce became manager at the age of just 26, and went on to hold the position until 2007.

In 1981 the club were transferred to Division One of the Isthmian League, and were promoted at the end of the 1981-82 season after finishing second. In 1984-85 they reached the first round of the FA Cup again, beating Swansea City 3-1 in a replay after a 1-1 draw at the Vetch Field. In the second round they lost 6-2 at Reading. They reached the second round again the following season, beating Enfield in the first round, before losing 6-1 at Gillingham. They went on to reach the first round again in 1986-87 (losing 1-0 in a replay to Slough Town) and 1987-88 (losing 3-0 at home to Torquay United). In 1988-89 they beat Football League opposition again, defeating Exeter City 2-1, before losing to Cambridge United.

In 1991-92 Bognor finished in the relegation zone, but were reprieved after Dagenham and Redbridge Forest merged. However, the following season they finished bottom of the Premier Division, and were relegated to Division One. In 1995-96 they reached the second round of the FA Cup for a fourth time, before losing 4-0 at Peterborough United.

In 2002-03 they finished second in Division One South, and were promoted back to the Premier Division. After finishing tenth the following year, the club were placed in the newly established Conference South. They were relegated back to the Isthmian League Premier Division at the end of the 2008-09 season, and were relegated again the following season.

Season 2010-11 saw the club compete in the Isthmian League Division One South and they missed out on promotion back to the Premier Division by the tightest of margins.

Having finished with a club record total of 96 points, they lost out in the title race to Metropolitan Police on goal difference by just one goal, having led the table by two points, going in to the last fixture. As a result, they found themselves having to participate in the end-of-season play-offs, where they lost at home to Dulwich Hamlet who had finished 31 points behind. Revenge was sweet, however in the 2011-12 they again finished second in Division One South. They won the end-of-season play-offs, defeating Godalming Town in a thrilling semi-final, before beating Dulwich Hamlet 1-0 in the final, and thus gaining promotion to the Premier Division.

The 2012-13 season saw them finish in 14th place in the Ryman Premier. The 2013-14 season started slowly with just one point from the opening four matches. However they soon rose up the table, eventually finishing in third place and qualified for the end of season play-offs, although this ended in defeat in the semi-final at home to Lowestoft Town.

Season 2015-16 saw them miss out on the Ryman Premier title by one point and then lost in the play-offs to Dulwich Hamlet. They did however, also enjoy their best ever run in the FA Trophy by reaching the semi-finals. They beat a number of teams from higher divisions along the way, including Bath City, Maidstone United, Altrincham, Sutton United and Torquay United. But hopes of an appearance at Wembley Stadium were dashed when they were defeated in the semi-final by Grimsby Town, losing 1-0 in the first leg at Nyewood Lane, before also losing the second leg 2-1 at Blundell Park (3-1 on aggregate), despite putting up spirited displays in both legs.

Season 2016-17 saw them finish in second place for the second season running, but this time they triumphed in the play-offs, beating Wingate & Finchley in the semi-final, before victory over Dulwich Hamlet in the final, to win promotion to the Vanarama National League South for season 2017-18

Season 2017-18 unfortunately saw the club relegated back to the Isthmian League, with last season being one of consolidation and a mid table finish. However the season did at least bring the excitement of winning the Sussex Senior Cup for the first time in 32 years in May at Brighton's Amex Stadium, with a 2-1 win after extra time against Burgess Hill Town.

Robbie Blake, the former Premier League striker famous for his exploits up front for Burnley in particular, was handed the manager's job in March 2022. Previously he had acted as assistant to Jack Pearce.

In the 2022/23 season, Blake steered his side into the Sussex Senior Cup final at Brighton's Amex Stadium only to lose on penalties to Worthing. The Rocks finished 14th in the league standings in the same season.

# GETTING TO KNOW: KYLE DANIEL-SPRAY

*Second place Westfield were hoping to take advantage of Leatherhead's Trophy absence to reduce the Tanners lead at the top, and Field were ahead at Hendon on thirteen minutes, Ethan Lindo scoring his fourth goal of the week. The hosts hit back twelve minutes before half time, Niko Muir's seventh of the season the equaliser, but Lindo soon scored again to restore the visitors lead. This time, they held it- and Field close to within one point of the leaders.*

*Hanworth Villa were the West London hosts for AFC Portchester, and the Villains went ahead just before the hour mark, Abdullah Selloum striking only four minutes after emerging from the bench. 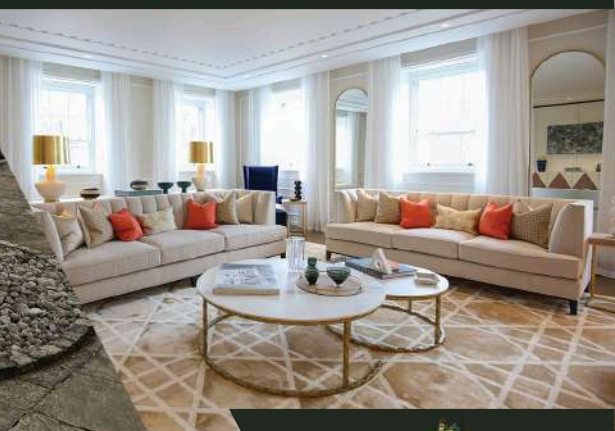
