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BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

Last Saturday saw us travel to Hanworth, to play a strong side that will 100% be up there in April in my opinion, challenging for promotion. Simon is a good manager and was full of praise for my team, which is another backhanded compliment, meaning, we are playing well, competing but we have to be better at taking moments in front of goal when they come! We must be better at not giving goals to teams as well. We lost 3-1, where we conceded again in injury time when we were committing bodies forward to get the draw. On another day we could have walked away with something.

A special shout out to U10 Girl mascots at our last home game V Fareham Town FC, singing and supporting all through the game, we all appreciated their support and this truly epitomises the community club we are. My players and Management Team are grateful for everyone's continued support.

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INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

EGHAM TOWN

The club was initially established as Runnymede Rovers in 1877, later reconstituted as Egham in 1905. They secured the West Surrey League title in the 1921-22 season, subsequently becoming founding members of the Surrey Senior League in 1922 and winning the league in its inaugural season. The club were runners-up in 1927-28, after which they joined Division One West of the Spartan League. A sixth-place finish in 1928-29 resulted in their placement in the Premier Division for the 1929-30 campaign. Following a bottom-table finish in 1931-32, Egham were relegated to Division One.

Egham exited the Spartan League at the conclusion of the 1932-33 season and returned to the Surrey Senior League. The club ceased operations during World War II and was not immediately revived post-war. However, a public meeting on 9 December 1963 led to the club's reformation as Egham Town. They participated in the Parthenon League for the 1964-65 season, before rejoining the Surrey Senior League. After two seasons, Egham moved to the Spartan League in 1967. The club won the Spartan League in 1971-72 and joined Division Two of the Athenian League in 1974. Triumph in Division Two at their first attempt granted promotion to Division One, where they later finished as runners-up.

In 1977, Egham entered Division Two of the Isthmian League. League restructuring relocated them to Division One South in 1984, with Division Two being reinstated in 1991. Relegation to Division Three followed the 1997-98 season, and the club remained at that level until the next restructuring placed them in Division One South in 2002. Egham then transferred to Division One West of the Southern League for the 2004-05 season, but returned to Division Two of the Isthmian League the subsequent year. In 2006, Egham left the Isthmian League to join the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League. They became Premier Division champions in 2012-13, earning promotion to Division One Central of the Southern League.

EGHAM TOWN

A third-place finish in 2015-16 saw qualification for the promotion play-offs, where they were defeated 4-2 on penalties by St Ives Town after a 2-2 draw. The following season, Egham finished fifth and again qualified for the play-offs, losing 4-0 to Farnborough in the semi-finals.

At the close of the 2017-18 season, Egham transferred to the South Central Division of the Isthmian League. They finished at the bottom of the division in 2018-19 and were relegated to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League. Subsequent league restructuring placed the club in the Premier Division North. Egham were runners-up in the Premier Division North in 2022-23, qualifying for a promotion/relegation play-off against Merstham of the Isthmian League, who won 3-1.

The 2024-25 season, which witnessed Egham's promotion back to step four, was masterminded by Jordan Berry, who had left for Harrow Borough for one season but came home to Runnymede Stadium for a title win in Combined Counties Premier North. A nine point gap between the Sarnies and runners-up Bedfont Sports was just one achievement, another being a club record 11-0 win at home against Hilltop.

THE week leading up to Halloween proved to be something of a horror show for Non-League bosses everywhere as the managerial merry-go-round clicked into overdrive.

As a result, it caused endless nightmares for us at NLP Towers as the news pages had to be constantly updated and, in the case of John Coleman's Friday afternoon arrival at Aldershot Town, ripped up and rewritten completely.

We were perhaps given a sign of what was to come when Kettering Town announced the departure of Simon Hollyhead just minutes after their 4-0 defeat at Redditch United on Saturday with the former assistant at Champions League side Malmö having resigned from his Poppies' post at two days previous.

It's fair to say it wasn't a good week for Isthmian League bosses with a high percentage of departures coming in and around the M25.

Club legend Drew Cooney left East Grinstead Town after four years in charge.

Cooney made over 500 appearances for the Wasps before taking over the hotseat in 2021.

He quit after picking up just one win from his opening 11 games in charge of the Isthmian South East club.

League rivals Hastings United also made a change with former Whitehawk boss David Altendorff replacing Lee Carey in the U's hotseat, while former England manager Peter Taylor stood down at Isthmian North side Canvey Island after five months in charge following the Gulls' midweek defeat to Benfleet in the Essex Senior Cup.

Tilbury too have new joint-bosses with George Christou and Jack Toghli coming in for Marc Harrison and Liam Wallace, who left the Dockers by mutual consent.

It was all change also at Lewes after it was announced that popular former boss Craig Nelson had returned to the Dripping Pan hotseat after six months away, replacing Bradley Pritchard.

Nelson steered the Rooks to their best league start in over a decade last season before being snapped up by Tonbridge Angels.

There's no busier owner in English football right now than Bracknell Town's Kayne Steinborn-Busse. He is looking for his FIFTH manager in the space of just 17 league games after dispensing with former Wealdstone and Notts County assistant Matt Saunders.

Saunders had just one point and an FA Cup win over Tadley Calleva to show for his seven games in charge of the Robins - a tenure which will be remembered for releasing the club's two longest serving players after questioning the commitment of the senior members of the squad.

Perhaps the highest profile departure last week was that of Altrincham chief Phil Parkinson after eight years at Moss Lane.

The 44-year-old led the Robins to two promotions in three seasons, from the NPL Premier to the National League, and then a play-off campaign in 2023-24, where they finished fourth before falling to Bromley in the semi-finals.

However, after losing a plethora of key players in the summer, including the likes of Regan Linney, Justin Amaluzor and Alex Newby, the Robins have struggled to find the same consistency this season and Parkinson leaves after a seven-match unbeaten league run.

Altrincham will now be looking to appoint a new man in charge, much like league rivals Aldershot Town, who brought in John Coleman to replace Tommy Widdrington, who left a fortnight ago, and has since rejoined Eastbourne Borough.

Harsh perhaps on Alan Dowson, who took interim charge of team affairs for Saturday's trip to Scunthorpe and told The NLP of his desire to make the most of his opportunity in the Shots hotseat. Dowson, the former Woking, Hampton & Richmond Borough and Kingstonian boss, has now left the EBB Stadium and looking for his next challenge.

At Step 5, Richard Brodie left Glossop North End after two years in charge of North West Counties League side and is now back playing with former club Skelmersdale United at the age of 38.

Dan Bailey quit as player/manager and coach of Combined Counties Premier North strugglers Virginia Water, Mark Scott resigned from South West Peninsula Premier East side Axminster Town after a 12th successive defeat and Clay Cross Town's management team of Ian Cotton, his assistant Ian Birtley and player/coach Kieran Coupe joined United Counties Premier North rivals AFC Mansfield. Aaannnnnd breathe. Until the next instalment anyway.

Third place Westfield hoped to reduce the gap between themselves and the top two as they travelled to take on Littlehampton Town, their hosts comfortably in mid table. Hayes and Yeading United's last league match, ten days ago, saw them concede seven goals- but they were in fine form prior to that and were hoping to prove that was no more than an aberration as they headed to Horndean. The hosts were second from bottom with one win in ten, but had shown signs of improvement of late- and they continued that with the opening goal, Brandon Chebby scoring it after only seven minutes. Dernel Wynter scored twice on Saturday, and twice the Saturday before, and he proved that he rather liked Tuesday's, too, scoring in the very first minute- indeed, his header was timed at thirty five seconds! Wynter completed his third brace in a row with a second fifteen minutes from time, and soon afterwards the visitors went down to ten men, Josh Bassey dismissed. That was that, Borough up to ninth.
