# BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

A very Merry Christmas to everyone at Hill Farm Lane today - it has certainly been a while but we are back and hopefully with a bang! Postponements mean the Moles are playing catch-up in terms of fixtures but that also means plenty of opportunities to bridge the gap on the teams above them hopefully starting today.



The Moles had built up some decent momentum before the bad weather got in their way. After booking their place in the Quarter Finals of the Velocity Cup for the second season running against local rivals Ascot, they followed it up with an incredible victory on the South Coast at Littlehampton. 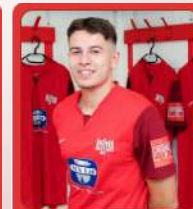

# INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

## BEDFONT SPORTS

Bedfont Sports Club was founded in 2002, when with considerable help from the local Council a lease was taken out on the near derelict Hatton Road Recreation Ground.

The only building on the site was refurbished to allow use as a bar and clubhouse on the ground floor and changing rooms on the upper one. Most of this work was carried out or supervised by the Chairman Dave Reader. Much work was also done to the playing area to provide playable pitches for Bedfont Sports on Saturdays and Bedfont Sunday, one of the oldest Sunday teams in Middlesex, on Sundays. To give the Club a junior section Bedfont Eagles, formed in 1978, joined the two adult Clubs a short time later.

Bedfont Sports started in the Hounslow and District League for two seasons and then joined the Middlesex County Football League, this being a feeder League to Step 5. More work was needed to enable the team to play in the Premier Division of the MCFL to which they gained promotion in 2004/05. After many ups and downs promotion was finally achieved to the Combined Counties in season 2008/09.

In the Combined Counties League Bedfont gained promotion to the Premier Division in season 2011/12 and have spent the past few seasons consolidating that position.

During this time the club worked hard to raise funds to upgrade our facility to one of the best in Middlesex. In 2010 we started work on Flood Lights and a new dressing room block was built together with a 3G five a side pitch and an 11v11 3G pitch along with over 750 seats in 4 stands on all 4 sides of the ground, which now complete gives us one of the best facilities not only in Middlesex but in the south of England.

Bedfont Sports is a true Community Club catering for 25 Junior Teams, a girls section, 2 Bedfont Sunday teams and our 1st Team who last season were promoted to the Isthmian League and step 4 football

The Youth Section is particularly vibrant playing in the Isthmian Youth League, and having won the Middlesex County Senior Cup back in 2015, and lost in the final twice in 2017/18 & 2018/19.

We are very proud that our Youth teams have been home-grown from Bedfont Eagles and with some real talent coming through this will continue for years to come.

A Club such as Bedfont Sports could not exist without sponsors so a big thank you to them and to the volunteers who give their time on match days and to the marking and upkeep of the ground and facilities.

In November 2020 we lost our leader, David Reader who passed away. He left a massive hole in the club and our community which we are still recovering from now. David was a true grass roots hero, building the club from nothing to make sure children in the community not only had somewhere to play, but also have the very best facilities. His legacy will live on through every Bedfont Eagle that wears the shirt and im sure he is with us at every game, kicking every ball and as he always said, trying to suck it in at the other end !!

Leaders Leatherhead welcomed Bognor Regis Town to Fetcham Grove, and with the first half seemingly about to end goalless it delivered two goals in added time, George Hedley putting the Tanners ahead only for Lee Seok-Jae to immediately equalise.

Leatherhead regained their lead seven minutes into the second half, Nathan Hogan with his fifteenth of the campaign, and Hogan got another eight minutes from time to give the Tanners some comfort. They needed that cushion, as in added time Seok-Jae pulled it back to three-two for the Rocks, but the hosts held on for three points- to go four points clear.

Westfield travelled to Harrow Borough looking to apply even more pressure on leaders Leatherhead, and they went ahead just before half time, Michael O'Connor with the opening goal of the match. Nine minutes after the break it was two-nil, Ethan Lindo taking his tally to ten in seven matches, but Gareth Chendlik quickly halved the arrears for the hosts and they drew level with sixteen minutes remaining, Dernel Wynter's penalty his thirteenth goal in eighteen matches. Right at the end, a killer blow- and we suspect you could also hear cheering in Leatherhead as Chendlik made it three-two to the hosts! Things were much quieter in the home end seven minutes into added time, however, as Tom Dryer levelled for Field- and the match ended three-three. It also ended with Borough down to ten men, Lucas Miller dismissed right at the end. Westfield stay second, but slip four points behind Leatherhead.

Hanworth Villa were looking for a tenth unbeaten match as they welcomed Kingstonian, and they were helped when the K's went down to ten men after only fifteen minutes, Rocky Williams dismissed. Villa went ahead in first half added time, Jack Timberlake scoring from the spot, and they added a second with twenty three minutes left, Brandon Curtis making them rather more comfortable with a goal from the half way line (pictured, [Nick Taylor](#)). They were more comfortable still when Liam Ferdinand made it three almost immediately, but they soon joined the K's on ten men, Marco Correia sent off only six minutes after emerging from the bench. It didn't matter- Ferdinand made it four-nil in added time, and Villa stay fourth whilst the K's are in the bottom four.

Hartley Wintney were at home to AFC Portchester, the visitors hoping to bounce back after defeat against Harrow last time out. Portchester went ahead with twenty minutes left, Josh Clack opening the scoring, and The Row's chances departed in the last minute when Lee Wort made it two. The Royals are up to eighth, their hosts slip out of the top five.

Raynes Park Vale were looking to rediscover their form as they hosted Hayes and Yeading United, but they were soon behind, Louis Rogers opening the scoring on twelve minutes. It was two-nil just before the half hour, Kaylen Hinds with that one, but Vale made a match of it by getting a goal back seven minutes into the second half, Jamie Splatt giving the home fans hope. As it turned out, hope was all they got, United holding on for three points and climbing into the top five.

Ascot United were ahead at South Park Reigate after only three minutes, Andrio Brandao with his fifth of the season- but they weren't ahead for long, Darnell Goather-Braithwaite levelling on the quarter hour, and twelve minutes before half time Jerry O'Sullivan put the Sparks ahead. What they had, they held- and climb to seventh.

Bottom side Fareham Town were at home to Hendon, but ongoing pitch issues meant that home was temporarily moved to Moneyfields. Hendon were soon ahead, Dave Diedhiou scoring for the third match in a row and for the ninth time this season, and on twenty six minutes Brad Dixon-Smith got a second- but the hosts were back in it before the break, Charlie Cooper halving the deficit. The visitors soon re-established their two goal advantage, Sam Shaban making it three-one just before the hour, and it got better still for the travelling faithful when Harry Brant got a fourth. That was that- hendon up to twelfth, Fareham fourteen points from safety.

Bedfont Sports were the hosts for Littlehampton Town, and they were behind on fourteen minutes, Jake Sayers breaking the deadlock. Just before the hour Marcel Powell made it two, but Sports then got a foothold in the match, Jude Jakes-McKay getting a goal back on sixty three minutes, but they couldn't find an equaliser and are fifteenth, one point and one place behind their visitors.

Southall welcomed Egham Town, the All with only one win in seven, the visitors seven without a win. The opening goal arrived ten minutes before half time, and it went to the hosts, Bright Siaw with it- and the visitors were reduced to ten men on sixty eight minutes, Omar Rowe seeing red. There were no more goals, and The All climb out of the bottom four.

Horndean needed three points as they hosted Met Police, and the visitors gave their hosts a helping hand when Simbarashe Kudyiwa was dismissed on eighteen minutes. It was a helping hand which the hosts took, gladly, and they were ahead eleven minutes later, Ewan Lynch with the opener. What they had they held- and they are six points from safety.

Last month, Tony completed another page of his giant log book where he has handwritten details of every one of the 5,780 football matches he has attended since his first admission in 1971.

In this week's NLP, in the shops, and online, as usual this Sunday, Tony looks back on a myriad of amazing adventures watching 70 Non-League matches throughout 2025.

Having travelled from Dublin, down to Cornwall and all the way up to Northumberland, Tony reveals his top 10 highlights for the second half of 2025 in date order to follow on from his NLP column from May.

Tony tells of his visit to his native Ireland to watch the FA of Ireland Cup, the last Cornish ground off his checklist and a trip to the Fylde Coast in the Isuzu FA Vase with a vociferous welcome.

He also took in the UK's first private football academy and a Midland Football League match abandoned in the first half due to high winds.

And find out also how Steven Gerrard managed a name check on his travels.

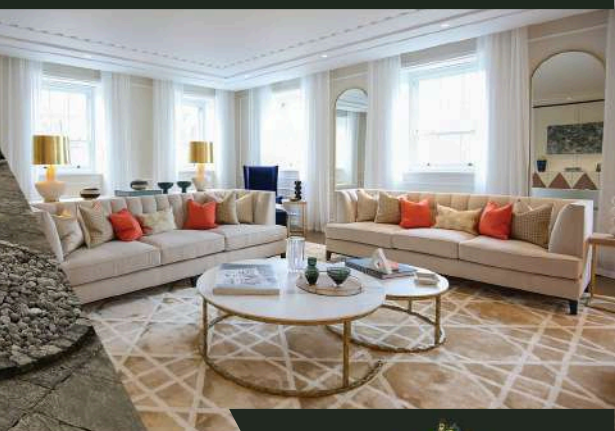
