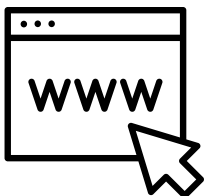

BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

Last Saturday we travelled to Portsmouth to play Farnham away from their normal home pitch, at Moneyfields FC, a ground which hadn't been kind in recent fixtures. This was a tough game, against a solid team who never stopped fighting for 98 mins! Huge credit to ALL the players, they showed real quality in both 18s when it mattered most, to secure a strong away win, with goals coming from Lamin, Owen & Kickie.

Last week we climbed out of the relegation zone, which feels like it's been a long time coming! The League is presenting itself to be completely different to the last 2 seasons. Last year we were in 14th place with the same amount of points, so as we go into a busy March, we must not get complacent with the big challenge we know we have in front of us to stay up, but our focus right now is the next game, which is today! I can assure you all, I will be making sure the team will be giving everything to get a result and give you all a committed performance.

BINFIELD VS HANWORTH VILLA

Good afternoon and welcome to the latest edition of the Moles' "home away from home" - this time at the Racecourse. A big thank you to our neighbours Ascot for their help in getting this fixture played. It should be a brilliant game on paper too with the in-form Moles taking on a Hanworth Villa side going toe-to-toe with Leatherhead for the league title!



2026 has certainly been the year for the Moles so far. They picked up three huge league victories in January in two against sides in the top six in the table and even though they didn't end the month how they wanted, they have picked their form back up in February. Despite having easier fixtures on paper, a two-nil victory at home to Hendon was backed up with a 3-1 victory on the road at Fareham Town last Saturday which saw them climb out of the bottom four places. Goals from Lamin Ceesay, Owen Smith and Kickie Dzimba completed the comeback on the South Coast last week and has seen them pick up four wins in their last five league matches. One league defeat in their last eight also means they've established themselves in second in the form guide and will carry that confidence into the final third of the season.

Our visitors this afternoon are once again competing at the very top of the Isthmian League table as they look to make the step up to Step 3 after moments of heartbreak in the past few seasons. A dramatic 95th minute equaliser from Jack Timberlake against league leaders Leatherhead last Saturday keeps them within touching distance at the top, albeit having played more games. Their home form is the best in the league and will be looking to build on their away form too keep up with the pace at the top.

The Moles fight back to earn three points at Fareham Town

It's four league wins in five for the Moles as they continue their momentum on the South Coast

On what looked quite a simple fixture on paper, the Moles got an early wake up call when Jamie Arnold gave the hosts the lead midway through the first half with a header at the back post.

But the Moles response was both instant and clinical. They were level five minutes later through Lamin Ceesay. He initially ran the ball across the pitch before laying it off to Toby Thompson on the right flank. Thompson cut the ball to Ceesay who picked out the top-left corner with a quality first-time finish.

And the Moles just needed another four minutes to get ahead. Ceesay and Thompson involved again as the goalscorer showed good strength to hold off his defender before realising the right-back. Thompson then put in a brilliant cross, picking out an unmarked Owen Smith in the box who headed in from close range for his third goal of the season.

And then Moles gave themselves some breathing room as they were gifted a third midway through the second half. The Fareham centre back showed too much of the ball to Quinic Patteron who pounced to slide in Kickie Dzimba who's composed finish earned the Moles three points on the South Coast as they continue their momentum.

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

HANWORTH VILLA FC

The club is experiencing our third consecutive season in Isthmian South Central League, our highest place in the football pyramid. In our first season at this level we reached fourth place, which led to us securing a play-off final place where we lost to Walton and Hersham. Last season, in a campaign punctuated with postponements and injuries we achieved seventh place. We're hoping to once again to see ourselves in the top quarter of the table but time will tell.

We've come a long way...

1976: Formation

Hanworth Villa was formed in 1976. In the early years, the team struggled in Division one of the Hounslow & District League, and scoring a goal was usually celebrated with a public holiday. During a close season, following hard work by Jimmy Connors, the team was completely rebuilt and this led to them finishing as Division 1 Champions.

The following Season saw the club start an incredible run in the league, which finished 68 matches later, with the club winning the Hounslow Premier League and the West Middlesex Division's one and two championships. The success continued with Hanworth being elected to the newly formed Middlesex County Football League in 1984/1985.

2005 onwards

It took a while to adapt to the new level of football, but in the second season they managed to win the Challenge Cup. The following season, 2007/2008, the team managed to successfully defend the Challenge Cup and also narrowly miss out on the league title, finishing a credible second. However the lack of facilities at the 'Ranch' prevented promotion to the Premier Division.

The club were determined to ensure that the situation should not arise again and with typical determination the committee managed to raise the funds to ensure that floodlights and a spectator stand were installed in time for the 2008/2009 campaign. The effort was not in vain as once again the team finished second and following a successful ground inspection Hanworth Villa were promoted to the Combined Counties Premier League for the 2009/2010 season

2009: Combined Counties Premier League

The debut season was as expected difficult with points being few and far between and it was not until the second half of the campaign that the team came to terms with the standard of football required. By the end of the season the team had collected enough points to finish 17th, three points clear of relegation. The first season taught the club a lot and changes were put in place to allow for a more comfortable second season, in which not only did the team finish in 5th position in the league, but also reached the finals of the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup and the Southern Combination Cup. Unfortunately they were to lose in both.

2011/12: Up for the cups

The 2011/2012 season will live long in the memory of all concerned at the club as being their most successful in national competition.

In the FA Cup the team, after victories over Shrivenham, Bedfont Sports, Wembley, Aveley and Slough, lined up against AFC Totten for a place in the 1st Round proper, a rare achievement for a team competing at national level 9. In a very close encounter AFC won 3-2.

In the FA Vase the team reached the third round losing to Herne Bay, one of the beaten semi-finalists that year.

2013/14: Double success

In 2013/2014 the team were successful in achieving a double, in winning both the Middlesex Premier League Cup and the Southern Combination Cup.

2019: Simon Haughney takes the reigns

In November 2019 the manager position was filled by Simon Haughney with his management team of Paul Thomas and Leon Solomon.

The players responded well to this new team and with the addition of several new signings performed well, despite the distractions of the Covid pandemic. Not only did they remain unbeaten in the ten matches played during the suspended 2020-21 season, they also set a new club record by progressing to the last 16 of the FA Vase, narrowly losing to Long Eaton United on penalties.

2020/21 Champions, promotion and unbeaten throughout the season

Last season proved to be the greatest in the history of Hanworth Villa FC and, in winning the inaugural Combined Counties North Premier Division and with it promotion to the Isthmian League, the club achieved their highest position in senior football since the formation in 1976. The most remarkable record of all is, however, that the team remained unbeaten throughout the league season.

2023/24 Seventh place finish

Hanworth Villa retained the services of Simon & Paul for the new 2023/24 season in the face of many approaches from many clubs for their services and look to build on the success of recent years.

After a difficult season with a large number of games postponed Villa found themselves playing a large number of games in a short space of time towards the end of the season and finished a creditable seventh.

The 2023/24 season was also notable with Gary Brunning, so instrumental in driving the club to the dizzy heights of the NLS step 4, stepping down as chairman being replaced by James Connor, Ex-Millwall professional footballer, and son of the original founder Jimmy Connor who's vision and drive will take the club further up the NLS pyramid. Gary Brunning moves up to Joint President of Hanworth Villa sharing the position with Jimmy Connor.

It should be noted that Gary Brunning not only drove the development of the club over the past 35 years but also gave unswerving service to the club as a player playing a big part of our achievements between 1978 and our eventual promotion to step 6 and the Combined Counties FL playing first team football well into his 40's. He was approached many times to play higher up the football pyramid by higher ranked teams but remained loyal to Hanworth Villa over all those years and for this the club will always be grateful.

2024/25 Progression Continues

The club's third season at step 4 proved to be an eventful one as the club continued to develop both on and off the pitch. The first team continue to build on success to reach a second play off final in 3 seasons. This time falling to a narrow defeat to fellow Middlesex rivals Uxbridge. But the season left much to celebrate with the club finishing in its highest ever position 3rd in the Isthmian League South Central Division.

We also had a record number of youth teams with much progress made by all of those sides.

Our match of the day came from Rectory Meadow, where second place Hanworth Villa, two points away from the summit, took on leaders Leatherhead. The Villains had only one defeat from ten, and knew that another victory would send them top- and they went ahead on twenty seven minutes, Josh Casey the scorer. The Tanners didn't take that lying down, and they were level six minutes before half time with Anas Igozoun scoring the goal, before going ahead in first half added time, Nathan Hogan scoring from the spot. Hogan added a third for the visitors early in the second half, but the Villains weren't dead and buried and with fourteen minutes remaining Liam Ferdinand brought it back to two-three. Five minutes into added time, the hosts declared that they were very much alive, Jack Timberland making it three-three. Leatherhead remain at the summit- and have four games in hand.

Third place Moneyfields were hoping to put last weekend's defeat at Bedfont Sports behind them, whilst hosts Raynes Park Vale's play off hopes looked to be hanging from a thread after only one win from ten. Vale, however, made an early breakthrough, David Omilabu scoring from the spot after a quarter of an hour- and they held onto that lead to take the points and climb into the top ten.

AFC Portchester took some fabulous form on the road to Ascot United, whilst their hosts had rather lost their way. The Royals were looking for a sixth win in a row, whilst the Yellas were seven without a win, a run which had left them dangerously close- two points- to the drop zone- and on that basis it was perhaps no surprise when the visitors went ahead on ten minutes, Alfie Stanley the scorer. It was two-nil four minutes before half time, Lee Wort with that one, but the Yellas made the closing stages interesting by getting a goal back six minutes from time, Tyrone Shiham halving the deficit. Sadly for the home fans, that's as good as it got- six wins from six and an eight point advantage over sixth place Hayes for the Royals.

Hartley Wintney had managed to play only once since December 27th, and travelled to Egham Town eleven points away from a top five spot- albeit with three games in hand. Their hosts had taken ten points from their previous four matches and were only a point further back- and they went ahead in this one early on, Connor Cullen's fifteenth of the season arriving on eleven minutes.

The Row levelled on twenty five minutes, Sam De St Croix delivering the equaliser, but Cullen soon struck again and just before the break Bradley Clayton made it three-one. On sixty five minutes Cullen celebrated his hat trick, only for De St Croix to bring it back to four-two two minutes later. The Sarnies made it five-two on sixty nine minutes, Excellence Muhemba the latest scorer, and finally the goals came to an end- a fine win for the hosts, who are up to seventh.

South Park Reigate, in eighth, were three without a win as they travelled to Met Police, the boys in blue having seen a three match unbeaten run come to a dramatic halt with a hammering at Fareham ten days ago. The Sparks got their noses in front on twenty four minutes, Ross Stepney opening the scoring, but their hosts were soon level, Jamal Sharpe with that one. On sixty four minutes the hosts found themselves reduced to ten men, Cerny Ando dismissed, but the visitors failed to take advantage.

Bedfont Sports were in decent form, with only one defeat from eight, and hoped for more of the same as they welcome a Harrow Borough side who had lost three of their previous four. Sports delivered the opening goal just before half time, Oliver Davidson scoring from the spot, but Borough were level eight minutes into the second half, Will Bailey getting the equaliser. That, as it turned out, was that.

Bognor Regis Town, in eleventh, had been on something of a downturn, with only two wins from ten. Their visitors, Southall, were in much greater need of points, but were five unbeaten despite only being outside the bottom four on goal difference. The Rocks got the first goal of the match early in the second half, Jake Lawrence with it, and for first you can read only. Bognor climb to ninth- Southall slip to twentieth.

Littlehampton Town, in fourteenth, were five points above the drop zone after a run of two wins from ten, whilst visitors Kingstonian were third from bottom, but had looked back to their best when winning their previous two and scoring four goals on each occasion. The start to this one was electric, the Golds taking the lead on two minutes through Gabriel Robinson only for Dennis Kelmendi to level two minutes later. The hosts regained their lead twelve minutes before half time, Owen Spicer with that one, but they weren't ahead for long before Stan Flaherty levelled from the spot. The goals then dried up, which leaves Littlehampton in fourteenth, six points clear of their fourth bottom visitors.

Only goal difference was keeping Binfield in the bottom four as they kicked off against bottom side Fareham Town- this match being played at Moneyfields. The Moles had won four of their previous five, but they were behind on twenty three minutes, Jamie Arnold striking for Town. The visitors quickly responded, however, Lamin Ceesay bringing them level five minutes later, and they were ahead four minutes later, Owen Smith completing the turnaround. Kickie Dzimba made it three-one on sixty four minutes, and the Moles climb to seventeenth. Fareham are now eighteen points from safety.

CHARLIE Wyke must be the bravest, but also unluckiest, footballer going.

Four years ago, the striker, now at Carlisle United, suffered a heart-attack during a training session for Wigan Athletic and actually died for four minutes.

But that traumatic experience was nothing compared to the physical and mental anguish the 33-year-old has endured over the last 16 months.

In October 2024, shortly after coming on as a substitute for Carlisle in a League Two match against Cheltenham, Wyke was felled by a heavy tackle from Luke Young.

“I broke my leg, dislocated my ankle, tore every ligament, damaged the cartilage - it was like six or seven different injuries in one,” the former Bradford City, Sunderland and Rotherham striker exclusively told The NLP last week.

“I had multiple operations, screws and pins put in my leg. And the pain - I honestly can’t describe it.

“Everybody knows about my cardiac arrest, and objectively that’s 100 times worse. But there was no pain with that. I had to have a lot of tests, missed a lot of football. Day to day, though, it didn’t really bother me.

“This was so much harder. I was battling the pain literally every day. I had to call an ambulance like three times because the pot on my ankle was too tight. At one point, I didn’t sleep for six nights straight and started hallucinating.

“I’d been watching Black Mirror on Netflix and there was an episode where somebody turns into a werewolf. One night, I thought the werewolf was in my bedroom. I was screaming and shouting. I felt like I was going mad.

“On top of that, I had the surgeon telling me I was done. I went up to see him five or six times, and the message was always the same. He said ‘You’re 33, it’s a massive injury - my advice is to retire immediately’.

“He said that nobody fully recovers from something like this, and even if I did get back to running and playing football then I’d struggle badly with arthritis for the rest of my life. You hear that, and your whole life just stops. It’s been horrendous, absolutely horrendous.”

Wyke defied his doctor's orders to continue a 14-year career that saw him score 130 goals in 358 EFL appearances, featuring in last month's 3-1 National League victory over Altrincham at Brunton Park. Or at least, it should have been emotional. Unfortunately for Wyke, part of the medication for managing his heart condition includes an adrenalin suppressant.

"The reception I got coming on, I should have been absolutely buzzing," he says. "But it's just a bit... different. It's the same when you score a goal. There isn't that rush.

"I think if I went on a rollercoaster these days, I'd just be sitting there bored, waiting for it to finish! It's a very strange feeling."

Sadly, he won't be back for long. Wyke may have won the battle, but acknowledges that the war is lost. He can barely train, suffers constant swelling and can't even manage half an hour of competitive action.

"I'll never be able to start a game again," he admits. "If you ask anyone who has been to the last few games, I can't even warm up properly.

"Coming on for five or ten minutes is just about alright. I could do 25 at a push. But if I did that my knee and ankle would swell up massive and I wouldn't be able to train for the rest of the week.

"So yeah, it goes without saying that my days are numbered. I'll probably go until the end of the season, then that will be me.

"It's not ideal. Nobody wants to retire, especially at 33. But as the surgeon said, you have to look at the bigger picture.

"My son Albie is six and he's mad into football. I've already missed a good 14 months of taking him to training, playing with him in the garden, all that sort of stuff. I don't want to be a 40-year-old dad who can't run around and can't play with my kids.

"Practically, as well, who is going to touch me? The gaffer here has been great, really understanding and supportive. But nobody is going to sign a player who can only play for ten minutes, especially with all the problems I've had."

So, a sad end to a promising career, but making that sacrifice for the sake of his son serves as a reminder to us all of the important things in life.

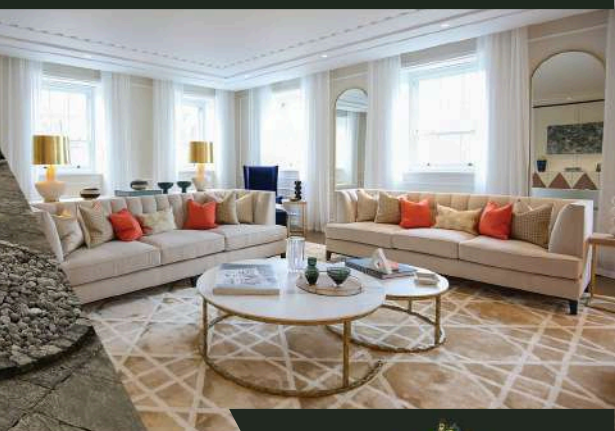
