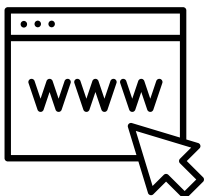

BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

THE VIEW FROM THE DUGOUT



Good afternoon ALL,

For the first time this year, we are finally get to play a home match on a Saturday afternoon back at Hill Farm Lane. It felt great to be back on Tuesday night despite the result.

Today we host Littlehampton Town FC, everyone at the club would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone attending this Binfield FC fixture. I'd like to wish the Littlehampton management team, their players, all their officials and fans a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home after the game.

As I have said in my program notes over the last 3 or 4 games, we have 9 matches left and there are no easy games left, starting with today against Littlehampton. Littlehampton sit one place below us, with a 1 point difference in our favour! This means today's game presents that there is a huge amount on the game for both clubs, a classic 6 pointer, where the result is key for both teams. I am expecting a physical and direct game, similar to the AFC Portchester on Tuesday night. Both teams will be competing hard for the result, a game I will promote calmness in how we go to work but a game we must deliver a performance I know this team can execute.

On Tuesday night we were finally back at Hill Farm Lane after a 60+ day absence. It was great to be back at the club, unfortunately we couldn't get the fairytale result where we lost 4-2 in the end. We gave ourselves a mountain to climb after a very lackluster 1st half, probably the worst half this group have delivered in months, going on 3-0 down, I had some harsh words to say at half time and I was very pleased with the reaction, scoring 2 goals early on to make it 3-2, with goals from TT and Jonesy, the goals gave us a real chance to get something from the game, unfortunately we couldn't convert the next chance we created and Portchester went on a counter attack and we gave away a penalty, which they converted, which killed any real come back on this occasion. I must credit our opponents though, Portchester were honest, hard working & efficient in their work, fully deserving of the win, definitely one of the best teams we have played this season.

If you didn't read my program notes from Tuesday, I will repeat some of them to give you an understanding of how I feel about the task we have in front of us. I have spoken openly to the players regarding the project we have on our hands to maintain step 4 football. As a group we know we are in a relegation fight with 8 other clubs in my opinion. The League this year is presenting itself completely different to years gone by, from 20th to 10th, there is a 11 point swing! So winning a few games in a row can catapult you into the top half, yet lose a few and the relegation zone will present itself. We have 9 games to go, 5 at home, 4 away! 1 game against a team in the play-offs and the rest of the games are against teams in and around us! The 5 home games I see as a huge advantage that I want us to our advantage. Where I feel everyone's support can play a huge part in helping us achieve this target.

Right now there it's not time to panic, it's time to believe and trusting the process, a process where I can promise you all, my management team, players and I will be giving everything to reach the magic number.

BINFIELD VS LITTLEHAMPTON TOWN

Welcome to Hill Farm Lane on a Saturday afternoon (that has been a rarity to say this year) but like London Buses the Moles are back at home for the second time this week to take on Littlehampton Town. Most importantly, our mascots are back after a Winter hiatus with our incredible Soccer School walking out with the first time ahead of a huge fixture in the Isthmian League.



The Moles' rollercoaster 2026 continued in the last seven days. Given the disruption with fixtures, our first team took on in-form AFC Portchester twice. The away-leg on the South Coast was a battling 1-1 draw which involved Sam Mead getting his first Moles goal on his first start. The reverse fixture on Tuesday went slightly differently. Portchester flew out of the blocks as they raced into a 3-0 lead inside half a hour. But the Moles began to make in-roads in the second half with a sensational goal from Toby Thompson and Nathan Jones reduced the deficit to one. But the away side restored their two-goal cushion with 20 minutes to go from the penalty spot which was enough to see them claim the three points. Positives again to take from the Moles performance including Nathan Jones' 4th goal contribution in three games but the team will be looking to get back to picking up the points, hopefully starting with this afternoon.

The Moles run riots as they deliver a shivering result at Littlehampton

Four goals, three debut scorers, two first seniors goals and a penalty save as the Moles make it three away wins on the bounce.

It took just three minutes for the Moles to open the scoring. Kickie Dzimba found some room on the left flank and picked out Owen Smith sliding in at the far post for his first goal for the Moles after having one cruelly ruled out a week before.

The fast starting Moles were two-up inside eleven minutes. Dzimba this time playing a through ball into Natty Boakye. He pulled the ball back to Lamin Ceesay on the edge of the box and he picked out the bottom corner to open up his Moles account.

And there was still time for them to add a fourth. Boakye picking out Pashley for his second of the game as the Moles ran riot and sealed a 4-0 victory.

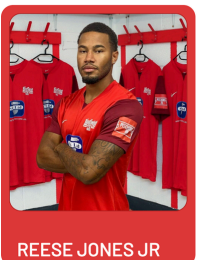
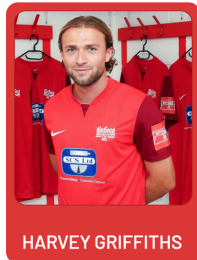

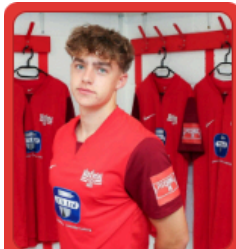

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

LITTLEHAMPTON TOWN

Littlehampton Town Football Club was officially founded in 1896, but evidence suggests football was played in the town as early as 1891 and the club started in 1893. In the early years games were played at Selborne Road but in the early 1900s sport moved to The Sportsfield on St Flora's Road where matches continue to be played today. Back then the team's colours were dark green and the club was known as the 'Greenbacks.' The colours were changed in 1911 to blue and then in 1931 to white. In 1923 Tottenham Hotspur came to town for a friendly and won 7-1.

Littlehampton Town joined the Sussex County Football League in 1928, and the club stayed in Division 1 for 67 years. The first match in the new league was against Haywards Heath and the team won 5-1. In 1949 they won the Royal Ulster Rifles (RUR) Charity Cup and the Sussex Senior Challenge Cup. The team changed to a gold strip in 1953 and the first reference to their nickname 'The Marigolds' was in the Littlehampton Gazette on 13th November 1953. Under the guidance of Terry Gill, the team was successful in the late 1960s, and they won the Sussex Senior Challenge Cup again in 1970. Littlehampton Town were Division 1 runners-up eight times until they finally won the title in 1991. That year will never be forgotten. A draw at Peacehaven & Telscombe in front of 1,400 fans meant Golds won the title on goal difference. The same year the club won through to the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. The highlight was a home match against Northampton Town, staged at The Sportsfield in front of 4,000 fans.

The Golds also reached the semifinal of the FA Vase, losing to Gresley Rovers over two legs. That year the team played more cup matches than league games and won the Sussex League Challenge Cup and reached the final of the Sussex Senior Cup too. Littlehampton Town dropped to Division 2 in 1995, and Carl Stabler came back as manager and took them back up in 1997, when they were again runners-up in the division. In 2003 they were relegated once more but made a swift return with a division 2 league and cup double success. They fell out of the topflight again in 2008 and spent six years in Division 2. Mark Bennett, a former player from the 1991 season joined as manager and oversaw the Division 2 title in 2013, where they only lost four league games all season and were finalists in the John O'Hara Cup.

In 2015 they recaptured the Division 1 title - for the first time in 23 years - on the final day and the last year of the Sussex County Football League. With Mark Bennett's departure, player George Gaskin took over management of the club and guided the team to a mid-table finish. A year later the team dropped out of the topflight and into Division 1. In 2018, Littlehampton Town welcomed back both Mark Bennett as manager and George Gaskin as striker to help rebuild the club and return them to former glories. The next two seasons were unfortunately curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In 2020, the Marigolds were unbeaten in the league, but no promotion was allowed. After a repeat performance in 2021, we did secure promotion on points-per-game. With George Gaskin joined at the managerial helm by Mitchell Hand, the first year back in the Southern Combination Football League Premier Division was arguably the best in the team's 126-year history to date. The Marigolds won the title again on the final day of the season in front of 1,000 fans. But it was also in the cups that brought them so much glory. As winners of both the League Cup and the RUR Charity Cup, a historic treble was nearly a quadruple as the team reached Wembley to play in the FA Vase final. As the first non-league team from Sussex to reach Wembley, it was an extraordinary achievement. And despite losing 3-0 in the end to Newport Pagnell Town, the amazing home crowds in the quarter and semifinals – of over 3,000 – ensured the entire town was behind the team in an incredible season.

The club finished a respectable 12th in their first-ever season at Step 4 in the Pitching In Isthmian Football League Southeast Division. After two further seasons in the Southeast league, for the 2025/26 campaign the Marigolds have been moved sideways into the South-Central Division.

In a perfect world, a life-saving defibrillator will hang up on the wall on every sports club or facility in the world and simply gather dust.

Sadly, though, there are occasions when these remarkable bits of kit are brought into use - and they might just save a life!

Take last weekend for example when The NLP became aware of three separate medical emergencies, including one where the life of an assistant referee was saved by a hero team captain

Martin Weedon, 73, - an official of more than 40 years - was running the line for Desborough Town's Spartan South Midlands League Division One Cup semi-final against Belstone when he twice collapsed during the early stages of the game.

The match was immediately abandoned while Mr Weedon was treated on the pitch by Belstone captain Mitchell Swain - a firefighter by day - and the two team physios, Desborough's Carl Mallett and Alan Dunphy, of Belstone.

The heroics trio deployed the defibrillator kept at the ground to restart his heart and bring him back to life before Mr Weedon was rushed from Desborough's VPK Stadium to Kettering General Hospital, less than five miles away, to undergo treatment.

"If Desborough hadn't had a defibrillator, Martin would have died 100%," Mr Weedon's son-in-law Andy Hobbs told BBC Sport after learning of the incident from Desborough manager Neil Healey.

"It's so important that sports venues of all sizes have them because they save lives."

"Neil called me to say Martin had collapsed and had stopped breathing and they were going to use a defibrillator on him.

"Apparently he collapsed once but tried to carry on. One of the players from the opposing team was worried and told the referee he didn't like the look of him and within a few seconds, he had fallen again.

"I believe their captain is medically trained and he and the others did an amazing job, they followed the right procedures."

Sadly, Desborough wasn't the only place to be thrown into an emergency situation last Saturday.

Coventry United also revealed on Sunday that their chairman Raymond Nowack collapsed suddenly after their home United Counties League match with Northampton ON Chenecks.

A statement read: "Thanks to the incredible work of our staff, especially our physio Lucy Stead, as well as assistance from manager Terry Anderson, Serena from the Butts Park Arena, the Northampton physio and assistant referee Kieron Large, plus the speedy response of the ambulance crew, Ray received immediate treatment and was swiftly taken to hospital He has since been released and is now resting at home."

And there was a further incident nearby, at Midland League Division Three side Leamington Hibernian, where the club revealed that an unnamed player had suffered a "heart attack" during their game with AFC Balsall.

The Step 8 club said on X: "It is in times like this that put things into perspective and shows the togetherness of the football family in coming together to help and support each other."

While it is unclear what medical procedures were deployed on the patients at Coventry and Leamington, it only serves as a fitting reminder, if one was ever needed, of the importance of installing a defibrillator at your local club's facility as a matter of priority and urgency.

In his NLP column last April, Francis Duku, a former Non-League defender and founder of The Sports Circle - a movement that aims to make communities healthier using the medium of sports & exercise - told how there are more than 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests in the UK every year - with a survival rate of less than one in ten.

The Sports Circle are successfully working alongside the JE3 Foundation, set up to honour the legacy of former professional footballer and National League winning manager Justin Edinburgh, who went into cardiac arrest at his local gym in June 2019 and passed away five days later.

Founder of the JE3 Foundation, Edinburgh's son Charlie, is leading calls for legislative change on the installation of Automated External Defibrillators within health and sports facilities, while raising awareness of cardiac arrest, delivering CPR training and empowering every person to act fast, with the right skills and access to life-saving resources.

"Early CPR and defibrillation can significantly improve survival chances," Duku said.

"If something happened near you at a game or just in the street, would you know what to do?"

"Through the JE3 Foundation, Justin's legacy shines brightly."

The events of Desborough last weekend are certainly testament to that.
