BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

On another day our forward players could have scored a minimum of 4 goals in the 2nd half, only to find a Littlehampton keeper in fine form. A must win game for us, that saw us take all 3 points and a clean-sheet! Another 3 points in the right direction, to help us towards our target.

That is now 8 games left - 4 at home, 4 away! After tonight, all our games are against teams in around us. With 4 home games left, I see our home games as a place where we can be resilient & take advantage of everyone getting behind the lads to support the team to achieve what we all want.

It was great to see calm in our work Saturday and tonight we need more of the same, it's not time to panic, it's time to believe and trust in the process, a process where I can promise you all, my management team, players and I will be giving everything to reach the magic number.

BINFIELD VS WESTFIELD

Good evening and welcome back to Hill Farm Lane - we are certainly making up for our time away from home in the last week. With just eight games to go until now and the rest of the season, every point and every goal counts. It is a big game for both sides for very different reasons but after a competitive reverse fixture, it should be another good viewing at home this evening.



Saturday was certainly a long time coming for the Moles. Back at a sunny Hill Farm Lane in front of a big crowd with our Soccer School as mascots is what it is all about. The team lived up the billing too as Amari Fashanu's composed finished delivered the Moles three points with a well-earned clean sheet. Then with moved the Moles up to 17th in the table - moving the Moles four points above Littlehampton in the process. But with Ascot's victory at Hayes & Yeading, the situation remains the same. Three points above the drop zone with games in hand on the teams around them. Win those games, they could move as high as 11th in the table - showing just how close it is. With it being so unpredictable, no points total will be too safe so they will be looking for all opportunities - including this evening.

Our visitors this evening sit fourth in the Isthmian League table with qualification for the playoffs looking nearly certain. It was the Moles who made the brighter starter, dominating the early exchanges and they found a breakthrough midway through the first half. Kyle Daniel-Spray's throw was glanced on by Natty Boakye into the path of Amari Fashanu. Fashanu was able to take it around the on-rushing goal keeper before threading the gap through the recovering defenders and into the back of the net.

It looked like it was going to be a case of how many for the Moles in the first half, getting into some fantastic positions but unable to find the target with efforts from Tyler D'Cruz, Kickie Dzimba and others just missing the target.

Into the second half, it was the Moles again who had a chance to double their lead when Fashanu led a breakaway but Boakye's shot was straight at the keeper. But a tactical change from Littlehampton saw them become more of a threat and came inches away from an equaliser when a shot came rebounding off the bar.

With minutes to go, there was a huge scare for Moles fans as a scramble in the box led to a poke goalwards from Littlehampton which beat CJ Fubler but Josh McMenemy was on the line to clear away the danger.

There was a chance for the Moles to seal the points when substitute Lamin Ceesay drove towards goal but his shot couldn't find its way past the keeper. It didn't prove too costly though as the Moles held on for the three points.

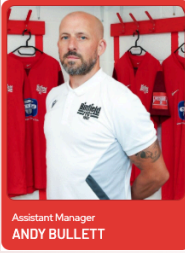

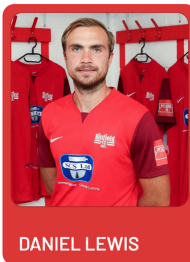

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

WESTFIELD FC

Westfield Football Club was formed in 1953 as Westfield Boys Club, playing in the Woking and District League and also running a youth team.

The 1950s

From the start the Club had success in the competitions it entered. Among the trophies won in the early years were the Surrey Youth Invitation Cup in 1953/54, the Surrey Junior Charity Cup in 1954/55 and 1955/56, the Surrey Junior Cup (at the first attempt) in 1955/56 and the Surrey Youth Cup in 1956/57.

Following several seasons in local league football, the Club made the break into Surrey Intermediate football using the present ground at Woking Park, Kingfield. Successes soon came and, after becoming League Champions and Cup winners on several occasions in the subsequent seasons, the Club decided to apply for senior status. The application was accepted in 1964 and after one season in the Parthenon League, Westfield met the necessary ground grading requirements and joined the Surrey Senior League.

The 1960s

Westfield's future success in senior football sprang from their ability to attract the best local youngsters, ably coached by manager John Martin and assistant Kenny Moody, with Les Butcher in a scouting role, and they were successful in winning the Surrey Youth Cup again in 1966/67 and 1969/70, and the Surrey Youth Shield in 1969/70 and 1970/71. This talent matured and there followed three tremendous seasons for the senior side, when they won the Surrey Senior League Cup in 1971/72, followed by the League and Cup double in 1972/73, and the League Championship again in 1973/74.

2000-2003

During the early 2000s, with former Woking player John Cassidy as manager, the senior side improved their league position, finishing sixth in season 2000/01. That season saw the Club enter the FA Vase again, having only previously entered in 1974 for 3 seasons, performing beyond expectations before losing in the Fourth Round to Ryman League Arlesey Town, on the way beating Wantage Town, Sidley United, Lewes and Bowers United. Season 2002/03 saw Westfield enter the FA Cup for the first time, losing at home to Dorking in the Preliminary Round. Westfield continued to compete at youth level and they won the Combined Counties Youth League Cup in 1991/92, as well as being runners-up in the League. Following the installation of floodlights in 1999, the U18 team joined the Southern Youth Floodlight League as members of the Western Division. The Club also ran a Youth team playing in the West Surrey Boys League, winning the U14 Challenge Cup and Premier Division in 1999/00, the U15 Premier Division, Challenge Cup and Surrey County Cup in 2000/01, U15 Division 2 in 2002, the U16 Premier Division in 2001/02, and the U15 Division 2 in 2002/03.

2007-2010

In the close season of 2007/08, following a highly credible 4th place finish, Martin resigned as manager due to personal circumstances; his departure signalled the exits of both David Howells and

John Comer. In July 2008 the position of 1st Team Manager was filled by Steve Plunkett, the ex-Godalming Town Reserves boss, though he was replaced within 4 months by the returning Dave Robson, as the club attempted to rebuild following a mass exodus of players. Dave Robson did a fine job stabilizing the club, but after an indifferent 2009/10 was replaced by joint managers, Craig Moore and John Comer. Off the pitch there was good news, as building of the new facilities commenced in 2010/11 and it promised to be a good season as the management duo assembled the best squad since the 2008 season. However, despite some wonderful results, the team struggled to find consistency and finished a disappointing 13th in the table. There was better news for the reserves who finished 4th in the reserve league, and reached the final of the league cup, where they went down to double-winning side Mole Valley SCR.

2016 to date

For the 2016-17 season, Tony Reid was appointed manager, and enjoyed a stunning season, finishing second in the League behind Hartley Wintney and winning the League Cup in May. The following season the Club continued to play exciting, attacking football, scoring an amazing 145 goals, whilst conceding only 45, and became deserved Champions with a fantastic 106 league points. As the 2018-19 season began, we said farewell to the Combined Counties League after 40 years of continuous competition and started an exciting journey into Step 4 of non-league football. Having lost some key players from the previous campaign, it took several months for Tony Reid to find a settled side, but then after Christmas a wonderful run of 13 wins, 4 draws and 4 defeats saw Westfield finish in fifth place, to gain a play-off place and our highest-ever league finish. A close semi-final play-off defeat to Bracknell Town did little to detract from a remarkable achievement. 2019-20 saw Tony's team again keep up the pressure at the top of the table, and were lying in a playoff position before the season was curtailed by Covid-19 cancellations, leading to the whole Isthmian League being declared null and void with 28 out of 38 league games played. By that time, the manager had decided to look for a new challenge and unfortunately many of our long-standing players took the same decision. It was a disappointing end to a great few years. Season 2022-23 started off positively, as the Field recorded two historic 4-0 wins over league favourites Leatherhead and Basingstoke Town, as well as making history by getting to the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Cup. A big shake-up happened mid-season as Manager Simon Lane left the club in February 2023 to join Step 3 side Kingstonian, and was replaced by former Arsenal and Woking midfielder Ian Selley. Selley guided Westfield to a respectable 12th placed finish, as well as an Aldershot Senior Cup Final, but they lost out 2-0 to Badshot Lea in the final. The 2023-24 season was a successful one, as the Field marked their best ever finish at this level by finishing 5th, securing a spot in the play-offs. They were unfortunately defeated by 2nd placed and eventual play-off winners Marlow in the semi-finals after the score ended 3-2 in extra time. It was not all doom and gloom however, as the Field made it to yet another Aldershot Senior Cup Final against Badshot Lea, this time lifting the trophy after a penalty shootout win. This proved to be Ian Selley's last game as Westfield Manager, as he joined Leatherhead ahead of the 24/25 season. Andy Crossley was named as the successor to Selley, but in the role of Player-Manager. His new look back-room team includes Assistant Managers Dave Powell and Jake Baxter, as well as coaches Kev Cleary, Ben Knight and Damian Lynch, as well as Physio Katie Williams.


