BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

THE VIEW FROM THE DUGOUT



Good afternoon ALL, today presents us with our last home game of the season. For me personally it's been great to have a full season in the dugout with better health than 12 months ago.

We find ourselves in a position where we still need 1 more point, from 2 games to mathematically secure our future at Step 4 in the Isthmian League. I hope that Binfield Drum will be getting behind the team to support us to finish our last home game here with a positive result.

Today we host Kingstonian FC, everyone at the club would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone attending this Binfield FC fixture. I'd like to wish the Kingstonian management team, their players, all their officials and fans a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home after the game.

Kingstonian FC find themselves safe, secure and a league position above us. We lost 2-1 away about 6 weeks ago in a tight game. We will be expecting the same today, where the players are ready to give everything to help us get over the line. The assignment of the game is for us to control our destiny with a solid performance. I can assure everyone, we have prepared in detail to get a result today.

Last weekend we played South Park FC at home and won comfortably 3-0, three different goal scorers, a clean-sheet and 3 more points in the right direction. A dominant 1st half display where we scored through Meado, Lamin and Amari, the defensive department then secured the win with a clean-sheet and solid display.

To summarise our 2025/26 season for the Moles; when we finish next weekend, we will have played 50 games in total, 42 league games and 8 cup games, as a group I feel we are 16 points short of where this group should be, based on lost points in games where we should have won we won, such as; Moneyfields at home, 4-1 up 10 minutes to go and the ref gifted them a point. This data excites me, as it tells me this young group has more to give! I am a manager that has a management team around me that is ready to guide, support and develop this group, we will use this year's learning moments to make sure we come back stronger next season. I set a target at the start of the season to compete in every game and stay in this division at all costs. We have quite comfortably competed in every game, now we just need to get business done to stay in the Division. I feel we could of gone further in the FA Cup and FA Trophy this season, losing 2 tight games and one on Penalties. This year defensively we have been much improved, with 9 clean-sheets.

I'd like to thank every player that has represented the club this season and made that happen, you all can feel proud of the work you have given to the club.

As always this club is a class act on and off the field. I would like to personally thank a number of people that have backed me, supported me and they don't get enough recognition; I'd like to start by thanking Chairman Andy, every game we have a debrief and I feel this has been crucial in making sure we get the whole club galvanised and heading in the right direction, Andy's efforts to make sure the pitch is ready to deliver results has been unbelievable, which leads me onto Borders, Luke, Dave & Lewis who work tirelessly with the Chairman to make sure the pitch is right. Next is Rob Sutton, I feel I talk more to you than my wife! A massive thank you for everything you've done, I feel we have created a strong working relationship which has helped us get every player out in that pitch in the most efficient way. Luke you have been brilliant with the bar and food after, making sure the players are filled up and ready to go for the next game. To everyone who has worked behind the bar supporting everything we are doing. Watto, a safe pair of hands, you quietly go about your work in an efficient way but it never goes unnoticed from my eyes! Rhys who basically does everything! Best kitman in the league! thank you for your help with kit, match day, you have been great in the dressing room with all the players, Andrew and Daisy, both have kept the website on point, kept up with all the signings and to Daisy, who managed to take great pictures of what we have achieved and dressing room photos that always capture that winning dressing room, it's so important we always celebrate success. The media team, Ollie especially, who has captured the whole season through our social media platforms, a space I know our players enjoy more than anything! John, our guy on the mic at every game announcing our goal scorers, we hear you! Craig, our Vice Chair, Graham the treasurer, the lads on the Turnstile! The Junior section of the club, the Mascots on match days, all the volunteers, all your work has been appreciated by me, my management team and the players, without the work of everyone above, we wouldn't have achieved Step 4 football for another season, it's always A MASSIVE TEAM EFFORT.

A special mention to Bowes who left us earlier in the season, a huge loss to the club, dressing room and our team. I didn't know Bowes before Binfield but I feel blessed to call him a good friend now. Thank you for all the support you have given me.

To my assistant Bully, words will never be enough for the support you have given me! They say loyalty is a dying trait in football! It warms me to say, that isn't the case in this fine man! Being the Binfield Way is built on the characteristics like Bully. I appreciate what we do together now and I can't wait to see what we can achieve together.

I'd like to finish by thanking Salil, sadly moving on at the end of the season.

I am sure I have missed key people here and I apologise if I have! But my last thank you is to my Wife and my beautiful Daughter, who have been my rocks! I love you both more than you will ever know. A poignant moment to mention everyone's Wives, Girlfriends, Boyfriends, Parents, family and friends who have supported us all, you've all played a magical part in getting us to where we are today, you all are deeply appreciated.

I always say never stop believing! So one last push to get that 1 point to get us over the line. I believe this club is in a much better place since my arrival in December 2023, lets all enjoy the couple of months break, as I can not wait to see what we ALL can produce for the 2026/27 season TOGETHER.

BINFIELD VS KINGSTONIAN

Good afternoon and welcome to Hill Farm Lane for the final time this season. There's been plenty of memorable moments at home this season as well as homes away from home and hopefully there's another one to add this afternoon. Kingstonian are the visitors this afternoon where we welcome back a very familiar face in Jamie Hilton who enjoyed a great year with us last season - welcome back Hilts. Hopefully, there will be one final enjoyable game of football and make sure you join us after the game for our End of Season Awards!



In a true reflection of their season, the Moles have pulled out two big results when they needed to make these last two games a little less stressful. Firstly a brilliant comeback victory against Bedford Sports where Kyle Daniel-Spray scored one of the goals of the season (or cross of the season!) before Nathan Jones scored in the 90th minute to complete a brilliant comeback in Bedford on Easter Monday. And the Moles took that confidence with them last Saturday as they scored three goals from Sam Mead, Lamin Ceesay and Amari Fashanu in the opening 40 minutes to dispatch South Park 3-0. Those results mean the Moles required just one point from their final two games to ensure Step 4 status next season. The Moles also sit just four points behind today's visitors Kingstonian so there's also potential to close the gap above them too.

Our visitors this afternoon sit 15th in the Isthmian League and have secured their Step 4 status for another season. After a tricky period around Christmas, results and points have rocketed since then and has secured them safety. That has largely been helped by a return to Kingstonian for Eddie Simon who has 14 goals since his return to the club in November.

BINFIELD 3-0 SOUTH PARK

The Moles make it back-to-back wins to put their Step 4 status in their gasps

After Nathan Jones' 90th minute winner five days prior, the Moles used that momentum as they opening the scoring inside two minutes. A brilliant Moles move led the Lamin Ceesay pulling the ball back to Sam Mead who converted his second Moles goal since his move from Hanworth Villa.

And then Moles continued that wave of momentum as they doubled their lead inside 11 minutes. Dan Lewis with a brilliant ball over the top to pick out Ceesay who showed brilliant composure to chip the ball over the South Park keeper to make it two-nil.

While the Moles were being clinical at one end, they were keeping clean sheets at the other. CJ Fubler doing really well to deny South Park from point-blank range and tip the ball over the bar.



And it got better for the Moles before half time. Amari Fashanu and Natty Boakye have been battling it out for the Golden Boot in the past few weeks but it was great interplay between the two of them to grab the Moles' third. Boakye pulling it back to Fashanu who picked out the bottom right corner.

The game petered-out in the second half as the Moles held on for their 9th clean sheet on the season and make it six points in a week.

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

KINGSTONIAN FC

The Kingstonian club came into being in 1919 as a result of the merger between Kingston Town FC and Old Kingstonians FC. However, the club can trace its origins even further back and celebrated its centenary in 1985; the reason for this is that one of its forerunners, Kingston & Surbiton YMCA FC played its first match on a ground in Bushy Park in November 1885. In 1887 the YMCA changed its name to Saxons FC. Then in 1890 it changed to Kingston Wanderers FC and once again to Kingston-on-Thames Association Football Club (KAFC) in 1893. Unfortunately, in the early 1900s there was trouble in the camp and in 1908 the club split in two with Kingston Town playing at Norbiton Sports Ground and Old Kingstonians on what became known as the "back pitch" at Richmond Road.

The new Kingstonian set-up started life in the Athenian League, a competition that it won in both seasons 1923/24 and 1925/26, playing its home matches at a brand new ground in Richmond Road that remained its home until 1988. In 1929 the Kingstonians, widely known as the K's, accepted an invitation to join the Isthmian League as a replacement for the Civil Service FC, and remained in that league until 1998.

The K's have a credible history and their blue ribbon period of the early 1930's produced players such as Frank Macey, Doug Whitehead, George Lee and the Whittaker brothers achieving in April 1933 its then greatest accolade by winning the FA Amateur Cup which well and truly put Kingstonian on the football map. Wins over Portland United (after a replay), Leyton, South Bank, Dulwich Hamlet, and Whitehall Printeries took the K's through to the final, staged at Dulwich, against Stockton, which resulted in a 1-1 draw. For the replay Kingstonian had to travel to Darlington, but despite going one goal behind after only four minutes, the K's came back to win 4-1 thanks to goals from Gibson, Urpeth (penalty) and Whitehead (2).

The 2005/06 season saw K's move up the table only to miss out on playoffs on the final day of the season, though silverware was achieved following a 1-0 win over AFC Wimbledon in the Surrey Senior Cup Final. McDonald was almost immediately succeeded by McIntyre as manager, whilst the club was jointly bought by Mark Anderson and Malcolm Winwright - the board would be completed by the presence of John Fenwick as chairman from May 2011 to June 2014 and then co-chairman with Anderson and Winwright until January 2018, when he became sole chairman again.

Stuart McIntyre's time as manager was unfortunately short-lived and unsuccessful, and midway through the 2006/07 season he was replaced as manager by former Walton and Hershman manager Alan Dowson. Dowson and his team immediately transformed the club, and achieved a semblance of stability. There was plenty of expectation for the 2007/08 season, though inconsistency led to the K's missing the play-offs once again on the final day of the season.

The 2008/09 season was successful from start to finish. A run to the Third Qualifying Round of the FA Cup was highlighted by a 4-0 home win over Conference South team Braintree Town, all four goals scored by midfielder Dean Lodge. This performance led to the K's player winning the Performance of the Round award from the FA. But it was in the Ryman League Division One South that the biggest success came, as a very strong start and a storming finish led to Kingstonian winning the division by seven points ahead of Cray Wanderers.

After an absence of four years, the club almost passed straight up through the Ryman Premier Division, recovering from a difficult start to reach the end of the season playoffs. It was Boreham Wood, however, who won the controversial final match. Heartache followed in the following 2010/11 season when a final day collapse at Margate cost another attempt at the playoffs. The following two seasons saw mid-table finishes in the league accompanied by successive London Senior Cup final appearances, before a return to the playoffs in the 2013/14 season, after the club finished runners-up in the league. A semi final defeat against AFC Hornchurch however denied the chance of promotion, in what turned out to be Alan Dowson's last game in charge.

With former K's midfielder Tommy Williams installed as manager, the club again reached the FA Cup Third Qualifying Round, losing 3-2 to a last minute goal against Eastbourne Borough. The league campaign was a roller-coaster, a late challenge for the play-offs falling short in the last couple of weeks of the season. In his second season, the 2015-16 campaign saw the K's lift their first cup in ten years, winning the Isthmian League Cup with a 5-0 victory over Faversham Town.

The 2016-17 season proved to be a difficult campaign, as the club flirted dangerously with relegation thanks to a dreadful run following Christmas; with six games left and hopes almost lost, Tommy Williams was replaced as manager by former Billericay Town man Craig Edwards. He turned the club around immediately and K's moved up to 16th after a five match unbeaten run to end the season. K's left the Kingsmeadow Stadium at the end of the season and moved to Fetcham Grove with Leatherhead FC; Edwards resigned in October 2017 and was replaced by former Whyteleafe manager Leigh Dynan.

At the beginning of the 2018-19 season, Kingstonian moved back to the Royal Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames and started a ground share with Corinthian-Casuals at King George's Field. A difficult season saw K's have three managers, as Leigh Dynan was replaced by Dean Brennan and then very quickly by stand-in manager Kim Harris - K's moved from second place in the table on New Year's Day to escaping relegation by a single place after a horror run of results.

The 2019-20 season may have been curtailed by the COVID-19 pandemic, but new manager Hayden Bird's arrival gave the club an enormous boost, and the K's supporters were rewarded amply with fine runs in both the FA Cup and the FA Trophy - the club reached the First Round of the FA Cup for the first time since 2000-01, and defeated Macclesfield Town 4-0 at Moss Rose in Round One before bowing out in Round Two at home to AFC Fylde on a day that saw the club host that afternoon's edition of BBC Football Focus. Their FA Trophy run also ended in Round Two but was most notable for a fine 3-1 victory over Alan Dowson's Woking team at King George's Field. The 2020-21 season was curtailed even more than the previous season, ending in November with K's sitting in fourth position in the Premier Division.

The 2021-22 season started out extremely well, with K's topping the Premier Division for a lengthy period before Christmas, but form then disappeared, and the club had to settle for an ultimately disappointing tenth place and a place in the Surrey Senior Cup Final, which was lost on penalties to Dorking Wanderers after a 1-1 draw. During the summer, the club moved temporary home once again, this time to Imperial Fields at Tooting and Mitcham United, and Lee O'Leary was appointed manager after the resignation of Hayden Bird. A difficult season ensued, Lee O'Leary stepped down due to personal reasons, to be replaced by Spencer Knight, who also resigned for personal reasons a couple of months later and was replaced by former Westfield manager Simon Lane, who saved the club from relegation. However, the 2023-24 was even more difficult for the club, as it started poorly and got worse. Simon Lane left in February 2024 to be replaced by his assistant Tutu Henriques, relegation became inevitable and the club finished bottom of the league.

In preparation for Kingstonian's first season in the South Central Division of the Isthmian League, former Walton and Hersham chief Scott Harris was appointed as manager, and his almost totally new squad had an exciting season, reaching the play-off semi-final, eventually falling in a penalty shoot-out to eventual winners Uxbridge. Scott took a break from managing in the summer of 2025, but returned in October that year after Dean Thomas and Mitchal Gough were replaced as joint managers.

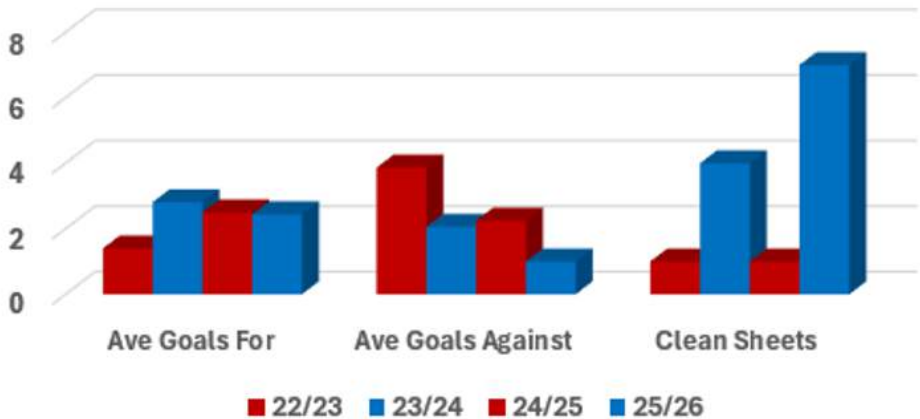

Binfield U18 Allies:

The Binfield Allies season officially ended last Thursday with a narrow 1-0 defeat to league champions Camberley here at Hill Farm Lane. As with the previous two seasons last season we are likely to finish 3rd in our division with 12 wins, 3 draws and 7 losses including cup matches. 3rd place represents the joint highest league finish since the Allies were reformed in 2022. Over those four seasons the management team has also grown so a big shout out to Dave Woolzley, Pete Jones, Ross Fairclough, Stuart Heaver and Martin Smith for the fantastic support they have given the team over the season. Also thanks to Den and Ange and especially Luke for the amazing off the field support on matchdays. Whilst success is often measured on league position this isn't the primary aim of our Allies. We used a total of 26 players this season 50% of whom joined the club back at soccer school and 70% have been at Binfield since u10's. We are blessed here at Binfield to have a great set of volunteer coaches throughout our junior section who have worked hard to develop these players over many seasons. With great talent in our current u15/u16 age group unlike many other clubs we will only be recruiting internally for the new season. Preparing players for the next level is another key objective and five members of the squad have been regulars in the U23 side this season. A further two have been recent additions to the U23 squad in last few weeks and this number is expected to rise next season as we continue to enhance the pathway into adult/senior football. The work that previous Allies head coach Nick White has contributed to this should also not be underestimated.

Mixing three age groups isn't always easy but again social skills development is key and as the season has progressed leaders have emerged, communication has increased and the group have really bonded. As we continue to move forward last Monday we held the first session for additional u15 and u16 players nominated by the coaches as having the potential to progress into the Allies for 26/27 season. No external recruitment as previous mentioned - we develop and grow the talent we already have. Loyalty to the club is key. Finally best wishes to those in the group undertaking GCSE or A Level exams and for those heading to University you know you are always welcome back anytime.

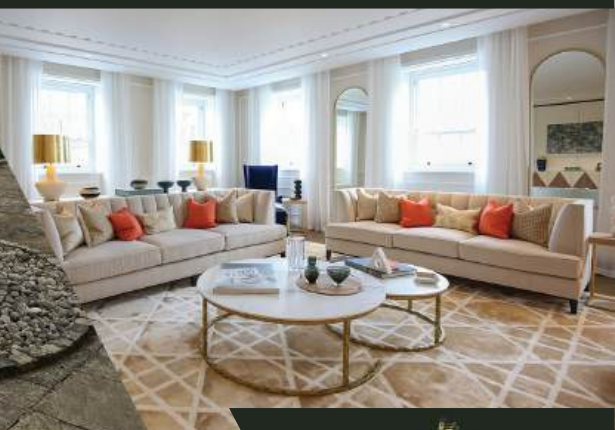
