BINFIELD FC HISTORY

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.

During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt - a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the member-ship, with over 20 teams playing every weekend - this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup - and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

In the two Covid disrupted seasons, the first team were sitting in second place in the Hellenic Premier. Positions when used to calculate points per game resulted in promotion to the Isthmian League South Centre, our 1st season ever at Step 4. However the 2020/21 season will, of course, be remembered for our amazing run in the Buildbase FA Vase when playing every game behind closed doors bar one and all away from home we reached the Final at Wembley where we came up against a very good Warrington Rylands side and narrowly lost 3-2.

In 2021/22 season in the Isthmian South Central, the team finished 8th after a good start. Disappointing FA Cup but a very good run in the Trophy. Winning at North Leigh, Herne Bay before a home win vs Chippenham and finally bowing out against Truro, missing a last minute penalty. In the 2022/23 season, the team finished 6th in the Isthmian South Central - our highest ever league position. In the FA Cup, we reached the 3q round, again our best ever performance, losing 5-3 away to Beckenham Town. In the FA Trophy, we lost in the 1st round proper away to Tavistock.

The 2023/24 will always be remembered as the season of the Great Escape. At Christmas, the team had no wins in the league, only 4 points and were rooted to the bottom of the table. Their only win was a 2-0 victory over Wokingham in the FA Cup. They were knocked out of the FA Cup after a replay at Northwood. There was poor performances in the FA Trophy and Velocity Cups with 7-1 and 6-0 defeats respectively. A management change just before Christmas with Ross Weatherstone taking charge. In his time in charge, Ross managed to guide the team to their first win against Met Police FC. The team finished with 8 wins and managed to finish 4 points and one position above the relegation zone.

2024/25 was the year of the cup run and giant killings. In the Velocity Cup, the Moles were on the road for every game and made it through to the semi-final beating Premier Division sides Dulwich Hamlet and Hasting United before losing to a strong Billericay Town. In the Berks and Bucks Senior Cup, they defeated National League side Maidenhead United before losing in the quarter finals to Flackwell Heath. In the league, the Moles improved slightly from last season finishing one position higher and with nine more points.

THE VIEW FROM THE DUGOUT



Good afternoon ALL, today's game against South Park FC is our penultimate home game, with Kingstonian FC next Saturday being our last. With three games to go, our current League position is 16th, where we find ourselves 4 points better off & a +10 better goal difference than the teams below us. Since my last notes, Easter weekend presented 2 games where we lost 2-1 to Southall FC at home & beat Bedfont Sports FC 2-1 away.

Southall was another tough defeat to take, only based on the fact I feel we gifted them the game, individual mistakes happen in front of both goal posts & when your down in a battle to stay up, you don't always get what your performance warrants, based on tension & nerves in your work. We went 1-0 up through a great goal scored by Amari.

It was nice to find ourselves on the right side of some of these tight games against Bedfont away on Monday. We showed great character to come back from 1-0 down, through belief & trust in our style of play to win the game. Our first goal demonstrated, we must continue to work hard! Kyle's cross come shot, was just the boost & luck we needed! Luck which we haven't seen much of this season. Scoring in the last minute of any game, always makes the win feel a little sweeter! A well deserved goal from Jonesy.

That is now 3 games left, with 2 home games left, if we can make this place a fortress, where we can be resilient & take advantage of everyone getting behind the lads to support the team, I know we will achieve what we all want.

I can assure everyone, there is no panic in our work, we've been in this position before. Our squad is strong & the pack is ready to execute what's required. I can promise you all, my management team, players and I will be giving everything to reach the magic number.

BINFIELD VS SOUTH PARK

Good afternoon and welcome to Hill Farm Lane. We are certainly at the business end of the season with just three games to go for all sides in the Isthmian League. The Champions are confirmed, the play-offs secured but two of six teams have their Step 4 fate still to be decided. The Moles are one of those six teams therefore it is another but a dead-rubber this afternoon.

After a tricky patch of fixtures and results, the Moles were given a huge boost after coming from behind to defeat Bedfont Sports. Kyle Daniel-Spray's incredibly audacious effort

midway through the second half brought the Moles level before Nathan Jones smashed the ball into the back of the net in the 90th minute to complete the comeback. It ended a run of five games without a win for the Moles and with a couple of goals elsewhere, it meant they leaped up two places in the Isthmian League. There's still plenty of work to do but three points today could ensure another season at Step 4 if Metropolitan Police lose against Bedfont Sports and Littlehampton fail to beat Hartley Wintney. The Moles will be fighting hard right to the end of the season and hoping to use the momentum on Monday this afternoon.

Our visitors this afternoon sit 10th in the Isthmian League and could finish as sixth this season. One defeat in their last six sees them sit 2nd in the form guide - conceding just two goals in that spell. Alex Body's goal was the difference against Hendon last Saturday and they will be looking to finish off the season with a flourish to cap off an impressive season.

Nathan Jones' last minute winner completes the Moles' comeback after cards & chaos at Bedfont

In an evenly balanced start to the game, both sides saw early goalmouth action. On his first start for the Moles, Milan Trotman went close but dragged his shot just wide of the post. Meanwhile at the other end, George Frise went close for the hosts but his shot ended up just on the wrong side of the post.

Amari Fashanu then went closest for the Moles as he did initially well to beat his full back but could only hit his shot straight at the Bedfont keeper. The early chances were then replaced by cards with eight, yes eight, dished out in the opening 45 minutes.

It was the hosts who took the lead five minutes into the second half when James Barnett headed in from a recycled corner. But then, the big turning point as Joe Smith was sent off for a stamp on CJ Fubler with 30 minutes remaining.

That began a passage of play where the Moles piled on the pressure. Kyle Daniel-Spray's long range effort was turned behind for a corner but Ethan Mosdell's header went just wide.

The Moles were level with 15 minutes to go when Daniel-Spray's attempted cross flew into the top corner in an incredible effort.

And after Lamin Ceesay went close again for the Moles, it was Jones who provided the winner in the first minute of injury time to seal a huge three points for the Moles in their quest for Step 4 football next season.

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS

SOUTH PARK FC

South Park Football Club was formed in 1897 and immediately became founder members of the Redhill & District Football League along with other local clubs Godstone, Meadvale and Reigate Priory Reserves. The club remain members of the league today.

The football club flourished in the years leading to the Second Great War but obviously declined during and immediately after it. A handful of stewards rallied to the cause however and quickly resurrected its fortunes. One legacy of the hostilities, the air raid shelter, became the focus of attention when it became clear that further improvements were needed to the facilities if sporting aspirations were to be advanced. Thus it was that a shower room and toilet block and a modest clubhouse were attached to this building. Funding for this was achieved through the tireless efforts of the 'Friends of South Park Sports Association' organisation. Despite these commendable efforts, the Association lived for many years on a hand to mouth basis with the management all too frequently having to put their hands into their own pockets to ensure its survival.

2001 saw Reigate Town Football Club move to South Park and the club became known as South Park & Reigate Town Football Club. In 2002 the club saw the formation of the first girl's team to play under the clubs name and we now have four girl's teams. The following the year saw the introduction of the youth team who are currently playing in the Southern Youth Floodlight League. The youth team played their home matches at Merstham Football Club from 2003-2007 as at the time we did not have floodlights.

For the 2003/04 season the club reverted back to its original name of South Park Football Club. In February 2004 the club became only the fifth in Surrey to be awarded the status of 'FA Charter Standard Community Club'. In 2006 the first team were promoted to the Combined Counties Football League and as our new changing facilities were being built played their home matches at Cranleigh. In their first season in the Combined Counties League the team finished in seventh place in the league. 2007 saw the completion of our new changing rooms and the erection of floodlights around our main pitch. This ensured that our first and youth teams could now play their home matches in South Park.

The 2013/14 season saw South Park win the Combined Counties League Premier Division and in doing so gain promotion to the Isthmian League Division One South. Our first season at step four saw us finish in a creditable 14th position. Each season has seen us improve on the previous season's league position with an 8th place finish in 2016/17. The 2016/17 season also saw us reach the 2nd Round of the FA Trophy where we drawn away to Tranmere Rovers. South Park finished the 2017/18 season in 13th place in the league. They also reached the semi finals of the Surrey Senior Cup for the first time.

The Sparks made a solid start to the 2019/20 season however manager Jay Lovett resigned at the beginning of November to take up a similar position at Burgess Hill. Martin Dynan was appointed as Manager in mid November. He guided Park to the ¼ finals of the Surrey Senior Cup and maintained their mid table position before the season was abruptly halted due to the Covid 19 pandemic. The 2020/21 season curtailed after 8 games due the pandemic. The 2021/22 season saw Park sitting in mid table in late January when Martin Dynan resigned. The club acted swiftly and appointed Redhill Manager Harrison Williams. Harrison and his management team settled in quickly and Park finished in 9th place in the league. Harrison resigned at the end of November 2022. Assistant Manager Tom Cope was appointed manager and the side matched the previous years finish of 9th place in the league with a higher points total.

Ahead of the 2022/23 season the club name was amended to South Park (Reigate) FC. Harrison Williams resigned at the end of November 2022. Assistant Manager Tom Cope was appointed manager and the side matched the previous years finish of 9th place in the league with a higher points total.

After such a good previous season, 2024-25 was a disappointing campaign for the most part with many of the players moving on. Tom Cope moved into the role of Youth Section Chairman and Rob Kember, formerly of Chipstead became our Manager. A strong close to the season saw us high up in the form table and pull clear of relegation.

It must also be noted that without the tireless efforts of the late Fred Dearmun, Geof Thatcher, Ray Wilson and Geof Arnold to name but a few, the club would not be in the position it is today.

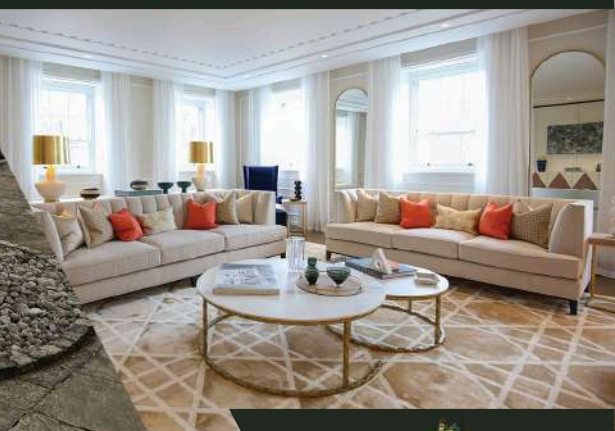
